Synopsis

A cocky ex-tennis champion, Chip Cox has seen the rise of pickleball on the courts where he taught tennis at his country club. His once flowing blond hair is now replaced by a receding hairline that he attempts to hide with hats and wigs. He lives in a run-down RV in his mothers' driveway. He has just been fired as a teaching pro at his local club and his mom just died and willed her house to her church.

Desperate for money, Chip decides to recruit the brooding Boris Baryshnikov, his old, singles nemesis and doubles partner, to travel with him competing in pickleball tournaments. One problem: they haven't talked in nearly 40 years and still detest each other. But the about to be evicted from his failing, marijuana-growing commune, Boris, has little choice but to join his old nemesis.

They live together in the RV, learning from each other, traveling to compete in tournaments across the country. In the end, they find the happiness they were seeking was the opposite of what they thought it would be.



Story Behind the Story

- ► The backstory and philosophical underpinning that drives the narrative comes from the ideological differences between the protagonists:
- Chip, the capitalist is selfish.
- Boris, the communist is selfless.
- Capitalism, unchecked, puts the priorities of the individual over others.
- ▶ Communism, in the purest form, puts the needs of others before the self.
- ► Chip's gluttonous greed and arrogance led to a gambling problem that left him morally and financially bankrupt and alone.
- Boris's naïve ideology left him alone and broke because he gave away everything he had. He thought that others would reciprocate his unconditional giving. They didn't. The commune was failing because he didn't understand how to get staff to work hard or compete in a capitalistic society.

- ▶ Both Chip and Boris thought their way of living was the right way and stubbornly stuck to their individual ideas about how to live. Both were wrong. Both were alone.
- ► These themes are woven into the story through the two men who are coming to terms with their eventual mortality and realization that they were stubborn and wrong.
- ► They eventually discover that understanding the other and working together is the best way to achieve success and happiness...And true success and happiness are different from what they thought it would be.
- ▶ Boris, the communist becomes a capitalist as the GM for the new Margaritaville Resort.
- ► And Chip, the capitalist, embraces communal living as a Pickleball teacher in exchange for room and board at Margaritaville.
- ▶ This is the real story we are telling that is buried subliminally to the humor of their adventures together both on and off the court.





► He has an idea: recruit Boris, his old, singles nemesis and doubles partner, to travel with him across the country competing in Pickleball tournaments, while promoting his autobiography. One problem - they still detest each other.

Chip uses his Amazon Alexa device to find Boris living in a failed commune in upstate New York. He calls him and says he wants to help Boris fix his financial problems. Chip doesn't tell Boris that he, himself is broke.

He hopes they can recreate their magical tennis chemistry through pickleball as partners while redeeming their reputations and wiping out their debt, even though they have not spoken to each other in close to 40 years.

Other potential actors for this role: Brian Cranston, Jerry Seinfeld, Ben Stiller, Adam Sandler, Daniel day Lewis, Jeff Goldblum, and Ben Afleck.

- ▶ Boris is a skinny, hairy, old school communist-loving Russian who loves to quote Karl Marx and Dostoyevsky. He came from nowhere to "win" the 1978 French Open singles due to a steroid drug test failure by Chip Cox (the reigning, six-time champion).
- Boris returned home after the French Open and promptly gave his winnings to the corrupt, communist party.
- ► He took orders to spread communism in America. He has been running a commune in Northern California for 30+ years.
- ▶ He is learning the marijuana-growing business while trying to manage and motivate a lazy staff.
- ▶ He struggles with the hypocrisy of his need to make a profit despite his antipathy for capitalism.
- ► He owes a lot of money in back taxes and is nearing eviction.
- Chip convinces Boris that they can play and win together on the Senior Pickleball Tour.
- ▶ Boris, the communist becomes a capitalist as the GM for the new Margaritaville Resort on the land of his former commune.

Referee Marcus Merriweather - TBD

- ► He starts off as the bag-boy assistant to Chip Cox as a youth after Chip thrashes him and embarrasses him with trash talk in a tennis tournament when they are both 10 years old.
- Later, Marcus becomes a prominent umpire and has run-ins with Chip at tournaments.
- ▶ He is head umpire at French Open and disqualifies Chip for a failed drug test.
- He strips Chip of his sponsorship in a scene at Tennis Club and fights over the oversized check with Lacey Underhill.
- ▶ He marries Lacey Underhill
- He is head referee of National Pickleball Championships


President Underhill - Written For Robert DeNiro/Chevy Chase

- Father of Lacey Underhill.
- No-nonsense former military Admiral and UN Ambassador who is the President of the club across the street from the home Chip Cox bought for his mom
- ▶ Built a statue for Chip in 1978 and put it at the entrance to the club.
- Hired Chip to teach tennis lessons after Chip is banned from playing professional tennis on the tour.
- ► Has put up with Chip for nearly 40 years since he felt bad for him since his daughter cancelled their engagement, his gambling losses, his losing sponsorship and being banned from competing again.


Lacey Underhill - Written for Jamie Lee Curtis
