

National Event Safety & Liability Policy & Event Safety & Liability Acknowledgment Form

Effective Date: May 8, 2025

Applies To: All chapters, members, leaders, volunteers, and event participants under Esther Funds Foundation

1. Purpose

- 1.1 This policy outlines the safety, risk management, and legal protection standards governing all Esther Funds Foundation (EFF) events.
- 1.2 EFF is committed to protecting its students, leaders, and affiliates while maintaining compliance with national law, university policy, and nonprofit liability standards.
- 1.3 All chapters must adhere to the terms outlined in this document to remain in good standing with EFF Headquarters.

2. Required Approvals

- 2.1 No event may be hosted under the name of Esther Funds Foundation without the following written approvals:
- a. A signed or emailed statement of support from the official chapter Advisor, and
- b. Final written approval from EFF National Headquarters.
- 2.2 Chapters must submit proposed event plans, dates, and venues to both the advisor and Headquarters at least 10 business days prior to the event.
- 2.3 Unauthorized events are not recognized by EFF and may result in disciplinary action, probation, or revocation of chapter status.

3. Age Eligibility

- 3.1 All participants, volunteers, and guests must be **18 years of age or older** to attend or assist with in-person events, unless otherwise authorized in writing by Headquarters for youth-specific outreach.
- 3.2 Minors are not permitted to participate in collegiate service projects, donation drives, or public programming unless designated as family outreach events and approved accordingly.

4. Risk and Safety Expectations

- 4.1 All chapters must maintain a basic safety protocol for each in-person event, including:
- a. Emergency contact list and campus/public safety numbers
- b. Clearly marked exits and awareness of emergency procedures
- c. Access to water and, if needed, a basic first aid kit
- d. Designated point-of-contact from the chapter executive board
- 4.2 Transportation must be voluntary. Students who choose to carpool assume full responsibility. EFF does not provide insurance or liability coverage for personal vehicles.

5. Incident Reporting Protocol

- 5.1 Any injury, conflict, safety breach, or concern must be reported to the chapter Advisor and EFF Headquarters within **24 hours** using the official **EFF Incident & Accountability Report Form**.
- 5.2 The report must be submitted by a chapter officer or advisor, and contain a factual summary of what occurred, parties involved, and action taken.

6. Liability Disclaimer

- 6.1 By attending or participating in any EFF event, all individuals acknowledge and agree to the following terms:
- a. Esther Funds Foundation is **not liable** for any injury, personal loss, or emotional distress sustained at or in connection with EFF programs.
- b. Esther Funds Foundation does not assume responsibility for medical costs, transportation-related incidents, property loss, or any legal disputes involving attendees.
- c. Chapters, leaders, and attendees assume personal and legal responsibility for their own conduct and participation.

7. Required Signature Acknowledgment

- 7.1 All participants, volunteers, and leaders attending events under EFF must sign the **National** Event Safety & Liability Acknowledgment Form prior to participation.
- 7.2 This form affirms that the individual:
- a. Is 18 years of age or older
- b. Understands the safety expectations and risk
- c. Releases Esther Funds Foundation from liability related to event attendance
- d. Agrees to uphold the Code of Conduct and represent EFF with integrity

8. Enforcement & Disciplinary Action

- 8.1 Chapters or individuals who violate this policy may face:
- a. Written warning or probation
- b. Event cancellation or denial of future approvals
- c. Temporary or permanent chapter suspension
- d. Legal reporting if behavior results in harm or organizational risk
- 8.2 Final enforcement decisions are made at the discretion of the Executive Director and National Compliance Team.
