CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS & BUDGET FOR INFRASTRUCTURE LOAN

Mr. Finz reported on several projects that will be coming up as action items later in the meeting. The projects include sidewalks, parking lot and Alberta infrastructure projects. He suggested we may have to refinance the infrastructure loan and borrow additional funds to complete all of the projects.

SURPLUS ITEMS

Mr. Finz reported he has gathered a list of surplus items from each department. He would like to meet with the Property & Equipment committee to review the items and discuss possibly renting out buildings that the town owns.

PERSONNEL MANUAL, ORGANIZATIONAL CHART AND EVALUTION SHEET

Mr. Finz met with the Personnel committee and they came to some conclusions for the short term. He continues to work on the personnel manual, organizational chart and evaluation sheet. He will meet with the committee again this month.

PUBLIC WORKS HIRING

One new person has been hired. He is looking to hire additional positions. Mr. Finz shared a report that he and Mr. Lynch compiled. The Twenty Year Evaluation 2001 - 2021 report outlines changes, additional services and progression of the utilities and public works departments.

CABOOSE

A representative for the restoration company will be coming in for a meeting on Friday to look at the caboose.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

REQUEST FOR FUNDS FOR CHRISTMAS PARADE - \$250

Ms. Wright reported that bands will not participate in the parade this year. The request is for \$250 for expenses for Santa Claus and Mrs. Claus. On motion by Mr. Pecht, seconded by Mr. Brockwell and carried by all ayes, Town Council voted to approve the expenditure of \$250 for the Christmas parade. Motion: Mr. Pecht. Second: Mr. Brockwell. FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

Also, 13 were in the LVFD First Due area, with 8 being mutual aid to other agencies. Approximately 84 man hours were expended. Mr. Gibson reported that Mrs. Jackson has submitted the application for 501(c) 3 status for the LVFD.

Mr. Brockwell commented on the Twenty Year Evaluation 2001 - 2021 report. He also commented that our personnel, our people do an excellent job.

SAFETY

Mr. Brockwell reported that the wastewater department report is in the packet. We do not have a Chief Water Operator at this time. Mr. Finz is submitting water reports.

HOUSING CODE ENFORCEMENT

Mayor Martin will meet with Mr. Finz on this.

PARKS/RECREATION

The LOVE sign will be discussed later in the meeting.

WELLNESS

Ms. Whitehead reported that the VCU Massey Cancer Research and Resource Center is promoting Integrated Health for November.

FARMER'S MARKET

Ms. Whitehead will schedule a committee meeting in the next few weeks.

TOWN COUNCIL ITEMS FOR APPROVAL, ACTION OR DISCUSSION LOVE SIGN

Ms. Wright reviewed the detailed report that she submitted for the agenda packet. The Virginia Tourism agreement is still valid provided no changes are made to the approved application. Mr. Gilson had completed the base frame for each letter. The concept design has not been applied to the base letters. Ms. Wright will continue to gather information and cost estimates for the project.

PURCHASE OF PUBLIC WORKS TRUCK

Mr. Finz reported that he procured a bid through Sourcewell for a new dump truck for public works. There are sufficient funds left in the Vehicles 2020 loan to purchase the truck. Mr. Finz reported the balance of that loan is \$206,780. The cost of the truck is \$108, 236. On motion by Mr. Brockwell, seconded by Mr. Pecht and carried by all ayes, Town Council authorized the Town Manager to proceed with the purchase of one 2021 International MV607 SBA Cummins L9 Engine, Allison 3500 RDS Transmission w/PTO with 14' Dump Body as presented in the packet. TOWN BRANDING PROGRAM

Mr. Finz reviewed the report in the packet and the costs for implementing the Town Branding program. He obtained two quotes for the proposed purchases. Mrs. Talbert and Mr. Brockwell asked Mr. Finz to also obtain a quote from Mike Thomas. He is local and a member of the fire department. On motion by Mr. Brockwell, seconded by Mrs. Talbert and carried by all ayes, Town Council authorized the Town Manager to proceed with the purchasing and implementation of the Branding Program, using Option #3 as the Town logo, at a cost not to exceed \$3,700 as presented in the packet, and to also obtain one more quote from Mike Thomas. STREETSCAPES SIDEWALK PROJECT – TOBACCO HERITAGE TRAIL

The original plan for the Tobacco Heritage Trail/Gazebo Sidewalk exceeded the project budget. Mr. Finz reviewed the three additional estimates for the redesign of the project. Mr. Finz recommended that Council approve Option 2 in the amount of \$280,605. The 20% Town share would be \$56,121. Option 2 includes the original sidewalk lineage and conduit for lighting for the future installation of street lights. On motion by Mr. Brockwell, seconded by Mrs. Talbert and carried by all ayes, Town Council approved Option #2 for the installation of sidewalk and conduit as presented in the packet. Motion: Mr. Brockwell. Second: Mrs. Talbert. MUNICIPAL PARKING LOT - PROPOSAL FOR BID PACKAGE AND DESIGN

Mr. Finz reviewed the bid package and design from B&B Consultants for the municipal parking lot. A section of the proposed lot would encroach on property owned by the Elm Acres Club, Inc. The Town would need to obtain a deed of easement from Elm Acres. On motion by Mr. Brockwell, seconded by Mrs. Talbert and carried by all ayes, Town Council approved the Town Manager's recommendation to proceed with Option #1 for the engineering, design and contract administration at an amount not to exceed \$20,000, as presented in the packet, contingent upon the approval of an easement by Elm Acres. Motion: Mr. Brockwell. Second: Mrs. Talbert. COVID DISBURSEMENT - COVID-19 RELIEF CARES ACT

Mr. Finz reported that the Town received additional COVID-19 Relief funds in the amount of \$90,213. All funds must be expended by the end of December. Mr. Finz met with the Finance committee regarding possible expenditures and he also consulted with Keli Reekes with Brunswick County. The Town Manager recommends the balance of funds be spent on: 42" scanner-printer-\$10,550, air packs for fire department-\$45,166, electronic access control door for office-\$3,395, 11 laptops for council members and staff-\$12,000, electric sign with trailer-\$12,000, 2 drones including equipment and training costs-\$13,332, allocate funds for a credit of \$35 for active residential water and sewer connections to total \$41,160. There was a report that the Governor had announced funds for jurisdictions with deficiencies on customer utility bills. If this is correct, then the Town could possibly use the Town funds for other needs. Mr. Finz advised he did not receive that information. Mr. Brockwell made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Williams, that Town Council approve the allocation of remaining COVID-19 Relief Funds per the Town Manager's recommendations with the exception of the \$35 reimbursement. Council discussed the recommended expenditures. Mr. Brockwell withdrew his original motion. Mr. Brockwell then made an amended motion, seconded by Mrs. Talbert, that Town Council approve the allocation of remaining COVID-19 Relief Funds per the Town Manager's recommendations including the \$35 credit to active water and sewer connections as presented. Motion: Mr. Brockwell. Second: Mrs. Talbert. Roll call vote: Mrs. Bland, absent (lost connection); Mr. Brockwell, aye; Ms. Hardy, absent; Mr. Pecht, aye; Mrs. Talbert, aye; Ms. Whitehead, ave; Ms. Williams, aye.
