### **Lenten Listening**

Lent will be here before we know it, whether we are ready or not. I always appreciate the lenten invitation to get honest with ourselves... about the truth of the world, about our mortality and our struggles. As a season of preparation for Easter, this honesty inevitably makes us realize how much we need the promise of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

So, let's be honest: times were already tough for churches before the pandemic. Now, it's even more challenging to connect with people. And, we know that all too well here at Northbrook. This season of Lent, what might we need to get honest about? How might we need to trust the promise of Easter?

We'll kick off this year's lenten journey with an **Ash Wednesday service at 7pm**. During Lent, Northbrook will be using resources from a group called *Sanctified Art*. Other pastors have found the materials quite meaningful. Our theme for the season of Lent will be "seeking: honest questions for a deeper faith" and we'll have a variety of resources - from a daily devotional to children's materials to original art - to add depth and breadth to the season.

I've always loved asking the big questions. What I'm learning to love even more is listening deeply - to God and others in the family of faith - to find answers. I look forward to Lent as a time of listening to God and each other.

But, before Lent starts, we're going to have a great opportunity to practice our listening at our upcoming **Vision & Planning Day on Saturday, February 11 from 10am-2pm**. Given the profound changes going on all around us, the leadership of Northbrook is ready to do some long-range planning to ensure that we are faithful and fruitful for years to come. If you have a heart for Christ and how we are called to serve him in our neighborhood and beyond, you are invited to gather as we listen deeply to God and each other so we can take the next step together into the future God has planned for us.

# Bedding Collection: January 29 - February 6 Sending a Big Valentine Hug to Oakland County Neighbors

Let's send some Northbrook warmth to those less fortunate who receive beds and bedding from the Furniture Bank of Southeastern Michigan. For our February Care & Share, we will partner with the Furniture Bank to help provide NEW bedding. While all sizes are accepted, there is a greater need for twin sizes, especially for children and youth. Bedding sets are appreciated, though not necessary.

Located in Pontiac, the <u>Furniture Bank of Southeastern Michigan</u> picks up gently used items and delivers them to clients needing essential home furniture. In 2020, through the "Furniture for Families" Program, 6,981 individuals (2,183 families) were served. More than 55% were children under 18. The families served are usually coming out of a crisis situation – fire, eviction, homelessness. Thanks to the Furniture Bank, more children remain healthy by sleeping in a warm bed, more families can share a meal at a dining table, and more people can live in a home with stability and dignity.

### Senior Soup Lunch and Learn—February 23 at 1p.m.


Remember those cute little books that you and your kids read so very long ago? They had gold bindings and wonderful drawings on the covers. They sold for 29 cents each.

### Northbrook's Mission Tithe Dollars at Work as we Share the Love of Jesus Christ


In January, we distributed the following funds, thanks to the generosity of members and visitors:

Book Summary: Pachinko follows one Korean family through the generations, beginning in the early 1900s. Sunja, the prized daughter of a poor yet proud family threatens to shame them all because of her unplanned pregnancy. Deserted by her lover, Sunja is saved when a young sickly minister offers to marry her and bring her to Japan. Richly told and profoundly moving, <u>Pachinko</u> is a story of love, sacrifice, ambition, and loyalty. From bustling street markets to the halls of Japan's finest universities to the pachinko parlors of the criminal underworld, Lee's complex and passionate characters — strong, stubborn




women, devoted sisters and sons, fathers shaken by moral crisis — survive and thrive against the indifferent arc of history. <u>Pachinko</u> is a national bestseller, a New York Times Editor's Choice and an American Booksellers Association's Indie Next Great Reads.
