A Resurrection Soul Stroll

Our monthly soul strolls have been such a gift to me. Not only have I gotten to know the church property and neighborhood better, I've gotten to know my traveling companions and their _prayers for this place.

We started out in Advent, before the winter snow had settled in, pondering how we might welcome Christ's coming. We've continued the first Saturday of each month (with one Covid-forced pause), wandering and wondering together. Each journey, I discover something new about God among the people and in this place.

Speaking of journeys of discovery, I can't help but think about one of my favorite resurrection stories in Luke 24:13-35. It happened on the same day that Jesus had risen, and the disciples were still trying to make sense of what had happened. Two of them headed out to a village called Emmaus and a stranger started walking along with them. I've always experienced that something special happens when we walk along with others. Conversation just seems to flow freely. The disciples started sharing the story of Jesus with the stranger, and also how the women's tale of his resurrection had confounded them.

If you know the story, you know that the stranger was Jesus. But, the disciples didn't recognize him. Even after he explained everything in light of the scripture, they still didn't get it. Though, later on they reflected, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?"

When they arrived at their destination, they invited the stranger inside to share a meal with them. Then, they saw something they had seen before: When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them.

Then - scripture says - their eyes were opened, and they recognized him in the breaking of the bread.

I look forward to the journeys to come, especially those blazing heart moments when this whole God thing isn't simply something we talk/think about, but something that burns from inside our bodies. I also look forward to more chances to break bread together, trusting that - as we do so - we'll discover Christ's presence in new and life-changing ways.























Pentecost Special Offering
