Family Sunday—Graduation Sunday—Picnic Celebration!





Summer Backyard Book Study: <u>Tattoos on the Heart</u> by Gregory Boyle

Prepare to be inspired this summer - and share that inspiration with others - as we gather in our friends' back yards to explore *Tattoos on the Heart*, by Gregory Boyle. Mark your calendars with the dates below and stay tuned for host information.

For thirty years, Father Boyle has run Homeboy Industries, a gang-intervention program located in the Boyle Heights neighborhood of Los Angeles, the gang capital of the world. In *Tattoos on the Heart*, he distills his experience working in the ghetto into a breathtaking series of parables inspired by faith.



Arranged by theme and filled with sparkling humor and glowing generosity, these essays offer a stirring look at how full our lives could be if we could find the joy in loving others and in being loved unconditionally. In each chapter, we benefit from Boyle's gentle, hard-earned wisdom.

These essays about universal kinship and redemption are moving examples of the power of unconditional love and the importance of fighting despair. Gorgeous and uplifting, *Tattoos on the Heart* reminds us that no life is less valuable than another.

Behind-the-Scenes Collections Tour—Friday, June 24

We are so pleased to announce that Adult Education Committee is back in action! We are working on organizing a few activities for the summer and this is our first confirmed tour.

All are invited to attend the *Behind-the-Scenes Collections Wing Tour* at the Cranbrook Art Museum in Bloomfield Hills. This tour was even recently featured in a *New York Times* article titled *The Story on Modern Art and Design Housed in a Suburban Detroit Basement.* We will have the opportunity to descend to the lower level into the specially designed vaulted rooms where the artwork is stored and cared for when not being exhibited. The tour features over 7500 pieces of art by major notable artists including Charles and Ray Eames, Florence Knoll, Eero Saarinen, Ruth Adler Schnee, Olga de Amaral, John Glick, Andy Warhol and many others. It will include sculptures, textiles, ceramics, drawings, prints and paintings.

Our tour is scheduled for Friday, June 24th at 11am. The cost is \$15 per person and is wheelchair accessible. Masks are encouraged but not mandated at this time. If more than 20 sign up, we will break into two back-to-back tours on the same day. One group will visit the regular museum, at no extra charge, for a self guided tour of the current exhibition while the other group visits the vaults. You may drive on your own or we will offer carpooling from the church. Please sign up in Fellowship Hall.

A quick synopsis of the upcoming books (see dates below):

<u>Everything I Never Told You</u> is a moving story of family, secrets, and longing. It is both a gripping page-turner and a sensitive family portrait, uncovering the ways in which mothers and daughters, fathers and sons, and husbands and wives struggle, all their lives, to understand one another.



Monday, August 8 at 7pm

Save for Fireflies by Nathaniel Missildine—Enjoy memories of a cross-country family road trip from the unique perspective of Pastor Ben's college friend, Nat Missildine. In 2008, after years living in France, the author returned to his native United States with his wife and two young daughters to drive a full loop around the country. His travel memoir of the experience traces the rediscovery of home as a tourist with no fixed address and no planned destination. Covering 12,000 miles through 32 states, the book offers an accelerated take on the life of a new family as well as the story of a country that may have undergone a greater shift than the traveler who has returned to pay witness to its resilience and splendor. How does Nat look back on this experience now? How do you remember your family summer road trips? What does "home" mean to you? We hope you'll join us in reading a delightful summer book and joining us for an engaging discussion. Readers will need to purchase a book on Amazon.


