What Are We Doing Here?

What are we doing here? I find myself asking this question about the meaning of life often. On my good days, I can remember the wisdom of our Protestant ancestors in the Westminster Shorter Catechism: "Humanity's chief end is to glorify God and enjoy God forever." Gratitude and joy. That about sums it up. But, here's where the rubber hits the road: how do we cultivate gratitude and joy in the midst of a culture of entitlement and despair?

Whether or not we are aware, we are doing it each Sunday during worship. In September, we learned that worship is all about presence and practice: we are present to God and each other, and we practice our faith so we can live it in our daily lives. In October, our exploration of the parts of worship - and how they form faithfulness in our daily lives - continues:

10/2 - Make a Joyful Noise All the Earth (Music) - Psalm 66:1-4

The Bible is saturated with songs of praise to God. Followers of Jesus took the gospel to different lands, and each culture developed their own unique expressions of praise. On this World Communion Sunday, we'll get a deeper understanding of the depth and breadth of worship music by exploring songs from around the world.

10/9 - Dive In (Baptism) - Matthew 3:13-17

Like everything he does, Jesus takes baptism to a whole new level when he is dunked in the water. Each week, we have a reminder of our new life in Christ, and - on this Sunday - we'll have a special reminder as we baptize two of God's children, sharing the promise of Christ with them and welcoming them to the family of faith.

10/16 - Opening the Door (Prayer) - Luke 11:1-13

As we struggle through life - and witness others struggling - something inside us yearns to cry out to God... for help, for healing, for hope. Even when we don't get the answers we want, we find our hearts drawn to God and to the world. At it's core, prayer is about opening up to God's presence... and God's guidance for our lives.

10/23 - The Holy Spirit - Clyde Pritchard, Guest Preacher

Our brother, Clyde, will share a powerful word about the presence of the Holy Spirit in his life, especially in his season of grief. Not only is the Spirit our Advocate and our Comfortor in suffering, the Spirit draws to newness of life in the valley of the shadow of death.

10/30 - Giving Our Hearts (Affirmation of Faith) - Philippians 2:1-11

From the beginning, Christians have felt the call to stand and proclaim what they believe about Jesus Christ. Our Protestant ancestors have labored to proclaim confessions of faith in the midst of changing circumstances. But, there's much more to creeds than "belief." Ultimately, our affirmations are commitments to which we give our hearts.

2022 Summer Wish List Wrap Up

Northbrook, we asked... and you delivered! We are excited to share that your contributions were above and beyond our expectations for our summer wish list campaign. Here's a breakdown of your gifts and how they impact Christ's ministry here:

Budget Offsets - \$2,900

Your generosity helped us cover some ongoing expenses in our budget, freeing up resources to help cover the deficit in other areas. Gifts will help cover worship essentials (communion supplies and flowers) and support our LOGOS program. Donations will also help cover water and phone utility costs, as well as a generous contribution to cover a year of internet service, which is crucial for streaming our online services. Finally, a contribution was made to help support the Pastor Benevolence Fund so that people in crisis can be supported in their time of need.

New Items - \$3,200

Thanks to your gifts, Northbrook can make its grounds - and its worship - more welcoming. Several gifts were made for park benches and a picnic table. We're excited to install them around campus and welcome folks to linger here. Speaking of campus, a gift was made to add more flowers around our grounds, adding to the beauty. Finally, a sponsorship was made for a new microphone for worship, helping the service be easier to hear, both in person and online.

Camperships - \$8,645

The 2022 summer camp ministry was another success, with several young people increasing their involvement with the church, and some choosing to participate in confirmation in the fall. As registrations came in, we learned that several families would need campership support. After initial gifts were made, a special appeal encouraged even more generosity. Your gifts covered the cost of 20 participants to help them grow deeper in faith in the beauty of God's creation.

Northbrook Park Structure - \$12,758

Thanks to a matching grant challenge by one of our members, we were able to exceed our goal for a structure for the proposed Northbrook Park on the south side of the building. Your gifts - and a significant grant received by Northbrook Preschool - have helped us expand our original ideas for the space. Stay tuned for details to come about our plan for the park and the structure, and how they will serve both Northbrook and its neighbors.

Total Summer Giving - \$27,503

The Finance Team is very encouraged by your generosity in response to this new endeavor to help support Christ's ministry at Northbrook. Thanks for your support, and we are excited to explore other ways to nurture giving here at Northbrook in the future.



Everybody is welcome to attend the Northbrook Book Club discussion of *The Women of the Copper Country* by Mary Doria Russell *on* Monday, October 24 at 7pm in Fellowship Hall. This book is a Michigan Great Read Book sponsored by the Michigan Humanities council – join us and others across the entire state of Michigan who are reading this historical book. Book Summary: In July 1913, twenty-five-year-old Annie Clements has seen enough of the world to know that it's unfair. She's spent her whole life in the mining town of Calumet, Michigan, where men risk their lives for meager salaries—and have barely enough to put food on the table for their families. The women labor in the houses of the elite, and send their husbands and sons deep underground each day, dreading the fateful call of the company man telling them their loved ones aren't coming home. So, when Annie decides to stand up for the entire town of Calumet, nearly everyone believes she may have taken on more than she is prepared to handle.



Yet as Annie struggles to improve the future of her town, her husband becomes increasingly frustrated with her growing independence. She faces the threat of prison while also discovering a forbidden love. On her fierce quest for justice, Annie will see just how much she is willing to sacrifice for the families of Calumet.

From one of the most versatile writers in contemporary fiction, this novel is an authentic and moving historical portrait of the lives of the crucial men and women of the early labor movement "with an important message that will resonate with contemporary readers"
