Each year in collaboration with Session, we negotiate the pastor's annual terms of call. With the pastor's and session approval, we submit the "package" to the congregation for approval. We also prepare and publish the Personnel committee annual report.

Our committee prepares the annual budget in collaboration with the Finance committee. We make every attempt to provide fair and equitable wages to our employees.

The committee meets monthly and receives a pastor's report on the status of what is happening with Northbrook. We address any needs the pastor may have that require personnel actions. All of our discussions are confidential.

The committee is very grateful to the non "paid" volunteers that support the mission of Northbrook. Our volunteers are vital to our success and are much appreciated even though they do not fall with our span of responsibility. They support our staff and for this support we are very grateful


Northbrook Preschool
