From Fear to Favor

Do not be afraid! We hear these words often around the birth of Jesus. You might remember hearing Gabriel speak them in the visit to Mary. Or, you might recognize them when the heavenly host of angels appeared before the terrified shepherds. But, the words come even earlier in the story.

If we start at the beginning of the Gospel of Luke, we discover that there is another birth we need to prepare for (even before Jesus): that of John the baptizer, the one who prepares the way. Normally in Advent, we hear from the adult John, confronting the "brood of vipers" in the wilderness, wearing his camel hair and inviting the crowd to repent and be baptized. This year during Advent, we are going to hear the story of John's conception and birth. As we'll discover, John's birth is mysteriously and miraculously connected with the birth of Jesus.

It all happens in the first chapter of the Gospel of Luke, and as we work our way through it this Advent, we will discover a common refrain: fear. How is fear a part of your life as we gear up for round-two of Christmas in a pandemic? Is it mostly assuaged now that vaccines are widely available? Is it stuffed deep down in your subconscious, or is it simmering just below the surface?

We often don't want to acknowledge the reality of fear in our lives. When it comes to Christmas, I just want to head straight to the joy and good cheer of the season. But, I'm grateful that Advent names the truth of fear in our lives. We are not the first to feel this way, trying to celebrate as forces out of our control have their way with us. Like today, the time of Jesus' birth was rife with fear. The good news of the birth of Jesus is that God comes to us in the midst of our fear. But, that's not all.

Do not be afraid, for you have found "favor with God," Gabriel says to Mary. Again and again in the Gospel of Luke, we hear this amazing realization. The characters in the story acknowledge that, not only is God with them, they have been chosen to be a part of this amazing adventure of God being born. Their fear won't stop God from using them. Their fear won't stop God from favoring them.

However fear is present with you this season, I invite you to trust the amazing truth of the gospel story: God will find you. And, God will find you with favor.



Another successful Stewardship campaign is now behind us, and we wish to extend a sincere *THANK YOU* to all who made pledges for the coming year! This year's theme of *Gather*, *Grow*, *Give* urged us each to be intentional in setting aside time to contemplate the financial contributions we can make to our church, and appreciate how Northbrook fills our own spiritual cups. We endeavored for a 7% increase over 2021 in both the pledged amount and the number of new pledgers and, though we haven't quite reached our goals, we've made great progress thus far, and are inching closer by the day.

Our goals for this campaign were 90 total pledged households and \$325,000 in the total pledged amount. At the time of this writing, we've received 64 pledges for \$273,640. Your commitment helps the Finance Committee plan the annual budget for the following year.




Northbrook Book Club—Monday, December 6 at 7 p.m.

Northbrook's Mission Tithe Dollars at Work as we Share the Love of Jesus Christ


