Preparing for Pentecost

What a wonderful Easter we had at Northbrook! Whether you attended our Easter services in person or online, it was a joy to celebrate the risen Christ with you. Those who were able to attend the outdoor Easter Vigil had a new - and powerful - experience of an ancient tradition. Now that Easter is over, and spring is upon us, it's time to start shifting gears in preparation for the summer.

Wait. Not so fast.

Scripture invites us to take time to let the resurrection of Jesus Christ settle into our souls. The first disciples needed to break bread with Jesus, touch his wounds, and even eat broiled fish with him, before they were able to recognize and fully understand - and believe - that he was alive among them!



And, here's the thing. The resurrection of Jesus Christ isn't even the end of the story. In some ways, it's just beginning. Those very disciples - who struggled to understand that Jesus had risen - would be sent out into the world to share God's love in the power of the Holy Spirit. But first, they needed to wait for this power to be revealed to them.

There's a reason Easter is a season.

Speaking of revelation, *Shavuot* is a Jewish holiday that commemorates when God revealed the Torah (the covenant between God and the people) to Moses on Mt. Sinai. God had freed the Hebrew people from slavery in Egypt in dramatic fashion. But, they had a period in the wilderness when they needed to learn to trust that God would provide for them. It was only after they let this trust settle into their souls that they were ready to receive the Torah.

The Greek word for, *Shavuot*? Pentecost. Maybe you remember that, in Acts 2, Jews were gathered in Jerusalem from all over the world. They were there to commemorate the revelation of God through the Torah. But, they received an entirely new and wonderful revelation: the love of Jesus Christ... revealed to them through the power of the Holy Spirit at work in the disciples.

Have you moved on from Easter? How are you letting the resurrection - in all its fullness - settle into your soul? Are you pondering how the power of the Spirit might be revealed in your life?






Northbrook Book Club—Monday, May 3, 2021 at 7 p.m. via Zoom

The discussion will be lead by Pastor Ben with his father Gary as guest speaker. Undoubtedly, the discussion of these books will be lively and likely to provide some truly valuable insight. What kind of book is <u>HARBOR YARNS</u>? Fiction, to be sure. But like all fiction, there could be true events behind the tales. The reader might imagine taking a big cooking pot and tossing in some ingredients. Begin with a copious amount of whiskey broth. Certainly stir in, many hearty dashes of Garrison Keillor and Will Rogers. Then add several cupfuls of Mark Twain and Tristan Jones. Don't forget dollops and spoonfuls more of Edgar Allan Poe and Woody Guthrie. Stir it all around. Maybe, that's the book.





PEELING BACK THE LAYERS is a miscellaneous collection of ideas which

explore subjects in further detail. Larson employs the object lesson of an "onion", which if peeled back has multiple layers, each one different from the ones before. The book is an examination, an exploration, a 2nd, 3rd, and 4th look at otherwise obvious topics. He digs beneath the surface leading the reader into new insights and understandings. From the funny to the very serious, they will make you laugh or cry and want to discuss, possibly argue.


