Order of the Kingfisher

Last month, I attended a gathering of the Eugene Peterson Center for Christian Imagination, "...a community of pastors who embody a way of being that is faithful, contemplative, joyful, holy, and deeply human." This community of pastors is called the Order of the Kingfisher, based on one of Peterson's favorite poems: *As Kingfishers Catch Fire*, by Gerard Manley Hopkins. I was so moved by that renewing time on the shores of Lake Michigan that I decided to join the other members in committing to the Order of the Kingfisher. I wanted to share these vows with you so you might know my commitment... and offer a little support if I stray.

Hearing God's initiating Word and responding as an act of prayer, we commit to our Common Pastoral Rule, and with courage and humility, we make these vows together, by the power of the Holy Spirit:

Will you be a pastor who has fixed your heart and mind on God as your defining center, the energizing flame for all your hopes, prayers, and work; and will you surrender to the way of Jesus, the truth of God, through the life-giving Spirit – as faithfully handed to us in the Nicene creed? ***By God's mercy, I will.***

Confessing Jesus, as Lord, will you resist every idolatrous temptation to use the people under your care for ego or power, and will you resist the idolatrous enticements to bend your knee to the religious, political, and philosophical powers of this age? ***By God's mercy, I will.***

Will you love the ways Jesus appears to us in his body, the church? ***By God's mercy, I will.***

Will you use your voice to live and tell the Story boldly, even when your words seem weak – and in an age of lies and manipulation, will you tell the truth? ***By God's mercy, I will.***

Will you release control of your ministry, your reputation, and your success – and will you rest in the liberating truth that God, not you, saves the world? ***By God's mercy, I will.***

Will you rebuff the pull to isolation, image, and aloofness – and will you practice that essential art: friendship? ***By God's mercy, I will.***

Will you refuse cynicism and hold fast to faith, hope, and love? ***By God's mercy, I will.***

Will you give yourself to those most essential angles of pastoral work: scripture, prayer, and spiritual direction? ***By God's mercy, I will.***

Will you join the ancients who have gone before us by submitting your body (vow of chastity), your resources (vow of poverty), your power (vow of obedience), and your aspirations (vow of stability) to Jesus Christ? ***By God, mercy, I will.***

Will you Shepherd God's flock under your care, watching over God's beloved people – not because you must, but because you are willing, not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager to serve; not loading it over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock so that when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away (1 Peter 5)? ***By God, mercy, I will.***

In this season of Thanksgiving, I'm grateful for the wild and wondrous calling to serve as your pastor at Northbrook. And, I'm grateful for communities like the Order of the Kingfisher that remind me of the depth and breadth of Christ's Church that we are all a part of.

Do I need a dinner reservation? How do I make a reservation? What is the deadline?

- ◆ Yes. If you are planning to attend the dinner, a reservation **MUST** be made. Reserve now and **PAY LATER**.
- ◆ Reservations are being taken in Fellowship Hall after worship on November 2 and by phone call to Becky in the church office at 248-642-0200.
- ◆ Deadline is Monday, November 3.

What time does the Main Event start, and what do I need to bring?

- ◆ Check-in begins at 5:00 and dinner is served at 5:30.
- ◆ **Bring your calendar**- many items have specific dates listed
- ◆ **Bring your checkbook preferably** (or credit card) - if you pay by check, Northbrook does not pay credit card fees.
- ◆ **Bring up to \$20 in cash** (for TenTimes game)
- ◆ **Wear your DETROIT LIONS gear and bring your willingness to have fun!!**

Can I just come to the Auction portion?

- ◆ Yes, the Auction portion of the Main Event starts at 6:15. Arrive earlier to check in.

How can I participate if I can't attend the event?

- ◆ We will assign you a bidder number. Everybody who wants to buy something will need a bidder number. This includes your friends, too!
- ◆ If a non-attendee wants to buy a competitive bid item, please tell your church member friend to bid for you at the auction using your paddle number. If you are the winner, we will bill you later.
- ◆ Non-attendees can purchase raffle chances (\$5 each chance) for committee baskets and SET PRICE items. Items that qualify for non-attendee advance purchases are:
 - ◇ Committee Raffle baskets: A27, A28, A29, A30, A31, B27, B28, B29, B30, & B31
 - ◇ Set Price Items: A4, A15, A25, B19, & B24
- ◆ For advance purchases, the buyer needs to write a check dated November 8, 2025 to Northbrook Presbyterian Church for the amount of their purchase. The check and list of items they are purchasing must be received no later than November 6. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** If received on time, the purchaser's information with their assigned bidder number will then be entered into the Main Event database. Important: you should also email nancyjbest@gmail.com to let her know about these advance purchases. Handing the check and list of items directly to a MAIN EVENT committee member would be very wise!
- ◆ A non-attendee could be a church member, a friend, or a family member who can't come but still wants to purchase a great item!

Coffee Hour Volunteers

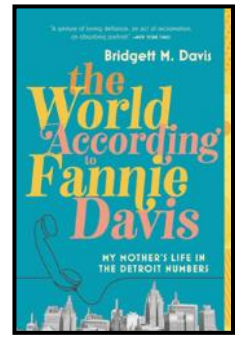

Coffee & Donut Drive Thru Success

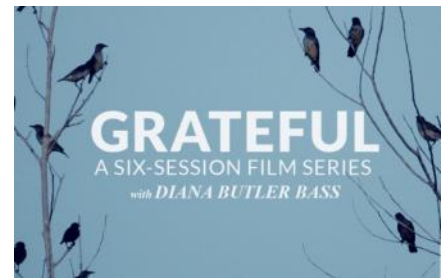
