### 2026 Theme for Northbrook:

### Abide and Thrive: The Power of Connection

Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing.

~ John 15:4-5

On November 22, we held a leadership summit for the elders of Northbrook, who were joined in the afternoon by staff, committee chairs, and other volunteer leaders. We wanted to keep finding ways to align our efforts, and we started working on a vision for 2026. We have been discussing growth a lot, but we wanted to make sure our growth was grounded in God's good news. We decided to focus on part of the farewell speech that Jesus shares with his disciples the evening of the Last Supper, as described in the Gospel of John (John 15:4-5).

**Abide** - "Abide in me as I abide in you." As a child, I remember hearing these words every time we took communion at church. Jesus reminded his beloved disciples that any fruitfulness they experience comes from their deep connection with God, the vine. During the retreat, elders were invited to reflect on abiding in God and what it means for their lives and this congregation. Some of their responses were:

- Trust the plan God has set out for us despite the rough journey ahead.
- Living a life of love and forgiveness. Understanding that there is no sin too great that it exceeds God's love, and treating others with that understanding in mind.
- Creating that environment of boundless love; for all to be welcome

**Thrive** - By abiding in God, we can not only survive as a congregation; we can thrive. The elders were also asked to imagine what it would look like to thrive, as individuals and as a congregation. Here are some examples:

- Deepen my faith; let go of what I can't control.
- To be welcoming; to be a place where others are invited to thrive; sharing joy and love but also sharing sorrow; forgiveness.
- Reaching many people making them aware of God's love. Growing in faith as a congregation. Growing in numbers as a church.

#### The Power of Connection

Throughout the coming year, we hope to focus on a few tangible ways we may abide and thrive together. One thing we've already begun is being more intentional about getting to know one another better as we gather. As one elder shared their vision, "Common vision brings common energy; power of our personal strengths working together." We hope you will join in our efforts to abide and thrive together in 2026. Like faithful growers, there may need to be some composting, scaffolding, and even some pruning. But, we're excited about the powerful fruitfulness that will come as we are deeply connected with God and each other.

Please join us in the Library at 1pm on the 2nd Thursday of the month for a delicious lunch and plentiful conversation. *In January, we will meet on January 8th.* 





Book Summary as written by the author: Lifelong neighbors and friends Agnes Lee and Polly Garner own shares in Fellowship Point, a beautiful summer colony and bird sanctuary on the coast of Maine. As they turn 80, it's time to make decisions about what will become of their legacy, a question that threatens their long, close, and peaceful friendship. Inspired by the breadth and drama of 19th century novels, this tour de force novel looks at the women's lives, loves, families and work across the 20th century, finally rising to a shocking revelation that will lead to a surprising answer to the dilemma.



Cynthia D'Aprix Sweeney, a New York Times bestselling author says "I can't remember the last time I've fallen so hard for a book. Fellowship Point is about many things: friendship, secrets, legacy, love, family—but the true magic here is in the writing. This captivating, unforgettable novel is thrillingly good."


### Northbrook Mission Tithe Dollars at Work as We Share the Love of Jesus Christ
