Welcome to Northbrook's Two-Page Plan

For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. ~ Jeremiah 29:11

We are so glad to finally share with you Northbrook's Two Page Plan in this newsletter. As you know, the Northbrook Session has been putting it together for quite some time, and our ministry teams have begun integrating it into their work. We used a template provided by an online church consultation group called Church Fuel, and it has proven quite energizing.

The first page will be our guiding document over the next three years. It lays out our **purpose**, expanded from *Living the love of Jesus Christ* to include experiencing and *sharing* the love of Jesus Christ. And, it states a clear **mission** that will be our focus for the next three years: "become a church *with* and *for* the community..." We wrestled a bit with our **profile**, because - of course - we want *all* to be welcome here. But, we acknowledged both Northbrook's history as a congregation that welcomes families, as well as our desire to commit to families for our future (knowing that family life has changed radically since Northbrook began). We enjoyed putting together our **values** and found them to be an honest reflection of both who we are and who we strive to be. And, we believe that there are people beyond our walls that would resonate with our **distinctives**. Our **keystone ministries** are the tangible ways we express ourselves and we would not be Northbrook without them. We hope that our **strategy** will be simple and compelling moving forward.

The second page is where the rubber hits the road in the plan. Our **three-year outlook** is our best effort at what we hope Northbrook will look like in three years. We look forward to measuring our **annual goals** and - after a long season of Covid - we are glad to be able to plan in such a tangible fashion.

I am most energized by the last column on the second page: the **90-day focus**. It has been helpful to think of setting goals in a bite-sized timeframe. We are just starting the rhythm of quarterly planning - based on the Two Page Plan - with our ministry teams and committees. It has been so encouraging to see them using the Ministry Action Plans (MAPs) to put their own goals in place.

Please take time to read through the Two Page Plan on the next two pages, and feel free to send us any questions you have. You can learn more at our **Congregational Meeting following worship on Sunday, October 1**. We have significant financial challenges ahead of us. We believe that God has a plan for Northbrook, and we can rise to any challenge when the whole Northbrook congregation finds their part in the plan!

PURPOSE

Experience, live, and share the love of Jesus Christ.

"Everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35)

Your purpose is your deep sense of why. It's the ultimate reason you exist and is rooted in Scripture. It's not going to change and it will always push you forward. Because of this, you'll never really accomplish it and it doesn't have an end date.

MISSION

Northbrook - Church and Community Center: become a church with and for the community that makes life better for individuals and groups through hospitality, connection, and spiritual growth.

"The Word became flesh and blood and moved into the neighborhood..." (John 1:14, The Message paraphrase)

While your purpose is eternal, your mission needs a due date. NASA's current mission is to land people on Mars. When they accomplish it, they will ask, "What's next?" Give your mission a due date and make sure everyone in your church can be involved.

PROFILE

Families with kids and young adults looking for a place to explore and grow their faith and find purpose, meaning, and community.

Most churches say "everyone" and while that's a great sentiment, it could set you up for confusion. Instead, think through who you are and what you do, and wrestle through who you are called to reach and most likely to reach.

VALUES

At Northbrook, we

- seek to learn God's story and share it with others
- roll up our sleeves and help
- believe kindness counts
- have fun together
- nurture faith growth
- try new things for heaven's sake

Values are words or phrases that describe who you are and how you behave. Some can be aspirational, meaning you're striving to personify them. Some can be obvious (i.e. we believe the Bible), but you should try to be specific.

KEYSTONE MINISTRIES

- Worship encountering God and being sent out to serve
- Group Fellowship groups for all ages to connect and grow (Logos, bible study, Men, youth, book club, etc.)
- Mission Tithing and Direct Service serving others beyond the congregation
- Camp experiencing faith and community in creation
- Preschool nurturing development in PreK children

Your church does a lot of things, but not all of them are equally important. Call out the ministries that hold your church together. What would fundamentally change your DNA if they went away?

DISTINCTIVES

At Northbrook, we

- welcome new perspectives and all voices
- enjoy being outdoors together
- dive deeply into faith learning and strive to integrate it into our living
- offer genuine care
- believe our community expands beyond our walls to neighborhood and around the world

Similar to core values, but an opportunity to be even more descriptive. This is what makes you different from every other church in town. This is where you reflect on your unique DNA. These often show up in your communication.

STRATEGY

- 1. Experience and share life with God
- 2. Prioritize the community beyond the Northbrook congregation, both in person and online
- 3. Serve others and build relationships
- 4. Steward the Northbrook campus and welcome the community to participate in its use

The most overlooked part of most church plans, strategy answers the *how* question. What are the steps you are taking in pursuit of your purpose?

THREE-YEAR OUTLOOK

Northbrook Church and Community Center will:

Two Page Plan™

- be an anchor in the community that makes life better for all connected
- be known as a congregation of welcome and faith formation
- have partners sharing space and serving the community
- have a focused ministry beyond our neighborhood that builds relationships and changes lives
- have taken tangible steps to be more financially sustainable

This is a place to crystalize your mission, vision, and goals and describe what your church will look like a few years from now. By giving words to your picture of the near-term future, you help people see where you're going. You're not trying to be artistic with your language, but specific in how you describe the future.

ANNUAL GOALS

1. Have at least 25% of the Northbrook membership (50 people) read *The Story* in its entirety so that our future planning and ministry will be grounded in God's story.

2. Increase the participation in keystone ministries by 10% of the Northbrook membership (20 people).

3. Align Staff and Volunteer Structure to implement Two-Page Plan.

4. Create at least 4 events/experiences that facilitate interaction with our neighbors.

5. Welcome at least 5 groups/individuals (congregations, presbytery, neighborhood org, etc.) to utilize the church as a way of serving them.

6. Host at least 6 events (weddings, banquets, etc.) and add at least 3 building users as a way to generate income.

7. Reduce the budget deficit by 20%.

8. Replace our church sign at the corner of 14 Mile and Lahser with a digital sign.

Your goals originate from your purpose and mission and you're tracking success through metrics and reporting. The intent is not to have too many, but to lift up a handful of goals that will be easy to understand and track. Alignment happens here.

9/20/2023

90-DAY FOCUS (4th Quarter - 2023)

1. Create a New Members team to focus church energy on reaching and receiving new members.

2. Connect playground dedication with the chili cook-off on Nov 5 to connect with preschool families/neighborhood.

3. Fall Ministry Summit on 11/12 to gather committees to coordinate and collaborate on 2024 first quarter planning.

4. Plan experimental monthly Sunday evening gatherings to connect with folks who don't attend Sunday morning.

5. Implement fall 2024 stewardship campaign.

6. Update website format to reflect plan (highlighting building use possibilities for groups/individuals beyond Northbrook).

7. Finalize design of park area near playground.

As your entire team pursues your annual goals, how can you make significant progress in the next 90 days? By breaking your goals into smaller chunks, you're more likely to make progress.

The Story Continues in October

Join us as we continue reading a chapter a week of <u>The Story</u>, an abbreviated version of the Bible in story form. Here is what's on tap for October. **Note: please see the updated reading schedule below for the remainder of the year.*

Chapter 4: Deliverance Beyond our Wildest Dreams - Sunday, October 1

In Chapter 4, Deliverance, the family has grown quite large in Egypt, but there is a new Pharaoh who "does not know Joseph" and enslaves the Hebrew people. Moses emerges - after time in the wilderness with God - as the one who will deliver the people from slavery. Pharaoh finally relents when a horror afflicts the Egyptian children, and he allows the Hebrew people to leave Egypt (though changes his mind and later pursues them). Through Moses, God provides in amazing ways, in the face of Egyptian aggression and Hebrew doubt. God's deliverance can come through people - and ways - we never could have dreamed.

Chapter 5: New Commands and a New Covenant - Sunday, October 8

The holy presence descends upon the mountain, revealing God's commitment to the Hebrew people. Unfortunately, the people aren't so faithful. Moses mediates between God and the people as they learn how to live with each other and worship God.

Chapter 6: Wandering - Sunday, October 15

The people repeatedly doubt God's plan and provision. Rather than enter the abundant land God has promised, they'd rather go back to slavery in Egypt! They are forced to wander in the wilderness for 40 years as a consequence for their doubt.

Chapter 7: The Battle Begins - Sunday, October 22

The people are ready to enter into the promised land. But, there's a problem: people are already living there. With God's help, the people overcome overwhelming odds to invade and occupy the land.

Chapter 8: A Few Good Men... and Women - Sunday, October 29

Judges rule the promised land as the 12 tribes struggle amongst themselves and with their neighbors. These heroes - both men and women - lead the people as they learn to live together in the land.

Do you know anyone who might want to read along? How about a neighbor or co-worker? Thanks to your generosity, we have 30 copies of *The Story* to give away to people. 

Stations of the People Mover Saturday, October 14


