#### **Longing for the Light**

#### Those who lived in a land of deep darkness...

This time of year, the darkness can feel a little overwhelming. And, it's not just the hours of daylight. The news reminds us of conflict and polarization, people in power who exploit the vulnerable, and the earth groaning under our mistreatment. There is also darkness in our homes and our hearts: insecurity, regret, shame, fear, and hopelessness. Though the details of the darkness - the shades of the shadows - may look different, each age is challenged by its own dark days.

One of my favorite Advent texts frames this struggle in his generation. Isaiah, the prophet, clearly saw how far God's people had gone off track. Civil war had divided the people, enemy empires loomed outside their borders, and the vulnerable were neglected in their cities. He described his people as "Those who live in the land of deep darkness."

#### On them light has shined.

The prophecy continues with Isaiah promising the people a coming light in the midst of the darkness.

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end.

He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever.

For generations, people repeated these words of the prophet, in the synagogues and in their homes. And they waited. They dared to believe that, one day, the Messiah - the anointed One - would be born.

In the midst of our own deep darkness, we also wait. That's what the season of Advent is about. It's also about trust. We trust that Christmas wasn't just a one-time event that we prepare to remember. When we put up the decorations, when we bake the cookies and plan the parties, when we serve others, we prepare for Christ to be born among us every day.

#### The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it.

In the midst of your preparations, may you be grounded in trust. In the midst of the heartache, may joy overflow.

And, in the midst of the darkness, may the light of Christ burst forth

...in twinkling lights

...Advent candles,

...and stars that show the way.

May it be so this Christmas,

## Angel Tree Drive November 16—December 7



I hope you felt that your "Star Word" journey brought you ever closer to the One who loves us unconditionally and wants the very best for us as we live out God's amazing love in all our relationships and daily lives.

And now, in closing, I offer a prayer from Henry Nouwen's book, Following Jesus: Finding Our Way

Home in an Age of Anxiety. Perhaps this prayer will bring you peace as we enter this busy

season of Advent and look forward to the new year.

"Dear Lord....Be with me today. Listen to my confusion and help me know how to live it. I don't know the words. I don't know the way. Show me the way. You are a quiet God. Help me to listen to your voice in a noisy world. I want to be with you. I know you are peace. I know you are joy. Help me to be a peaceful and joyful person. These are the fruits of living close to you. Bring me closer to you, dear Lord. Amen."

When this committee was first formed nine months ago, we hoped to raise \$10,000. Your gifts of time, talent, energy, creativity, and good old-fashioned hard work truly made this event one to be remembered. Your generosity in donating and buying made it financially successful. We are most proud to call this a "homegrown" event. All the talent came from within Northbrook - no outside professionals were needed. Northbrook Church is definitely a great place to belong! We work together as a community and live the love of Jesus Christ together. Amen.

Please enjoy these tidbits of information about the event:

- The Main Event is the vision of Liz Hurbis.
- 81 people were seated for the plated dinner. Additionally, 8 others came after dinner. Fellowship Hall was rocking like old times!!
- Dinner felt and tasted great! The food was prepared by many hands under the direction of Liz Hurbis. She created the menu and added her touches to make it really special.
- 5 youth learned about dining service, clearing plates, cleaning up, washing lots of dishes, and putting everything away. They even said they had fun doing all that work!
- 2 youth took care of children in the nursery while their parents enjoyed the night.
- The decorations took 2 days to put up by the talented Camille Cheairs. We know she had to spend significant time creating and preparing before installing. They came down much faster. She surely gets her exercise going up and down that huge ladder countless times!!
- Church Committee/Group Raffle Baskets were a HUGE hit. There were ten raffle baskets, which altogether, sold for \$2,665! At \$5 a chance, that's 533 chances bought- wow!! Tool Time with Todd brought in the most at \$475, or 90 chances sold!
- ◆ The TenTimes game was easy and exciting. It cleared \$588.
- We received cash donations of \$750 from attendees, non-attendees, and a local store.
- 13 different experiences were offered. These are all opportunities for buyers to fill their social calendar, and more importantly, share time with each other enjoying the activity.
- Bill Jordan designed the database program for the auction. He knew what to do so that the many spreadsheets could talk to each other and create a final invoice that each buyer received. We were ready to buy a program, but he simply said, "I can do that". Amazing!
- We did the right thing regulatory-wise. We received a liquor license (cost \$25) and a large raffle license (cost \$50) from the State of Michigan. Both were displayed at the event.

Our 2026 Stewardship Campaign is wrapping up, and we're thrilled to report that for our current campaign, pledges are tracking 10% above those from last year! Main Event activity will not be reflected on church giving statements. Be sure to contact your tax advisor should you need more information.




