# Everyone is Welcome to Witness Bishop-Elect Bonnie be Ordained And Consecrated on February 8

"We thank you, O God, for this day, and for your many blessings which we enjoy."

A major change is taking place in our diocese: our bishop-elect has begun to live and minister among us. She is getting to know the parishes, people, and priorities of southeast Michigan, and she will be ordained and consecrated on Saturday, Feb. 8 at the Ford Theatre. Every member of every Episcopal church is invited, welcomed, and encouraged to participate. If you have not witnessed a consecration, I urge you to do so, as they truly are Episcopal worship at its best.

Our new bishop comes to us from Chicago, a diocese with a long history of forming priests in the roles and responsibilities of the episcopacy. Bishop-Elect Bonnie will be the third priest from Chicago with whom I will have the pleasure of serving. The Right Rev'd. Jennifer Baskerville-Burrow of Indianapolis is an excellent bishop, as was The Right Rev'd. Clark Grew of Ohio.

Bonnie+ is passionate about church growth, having earned a doctorate in congregational development from Seabury Western Theological Seminary. She has a contagious passion for communicating the gospel of Jesus Christ in words and ways that people can hear and incorporate into their lives.

I hope that she will visit with us here at St. John's before the end of this year, and that you will come and begin to know your chief pastor. We will have the opportunity to share with her our dreams for this corner of our Lord's pasture.

#### "Ashes on the Go"

We have three more weeks of Epiphany, the season in which we remember the manifestation of Jesus as the savior of the whole world, and then Lent begins on Feb. 26. We will celebrate Holy Eucharist at 12:15 on that day and receive the imposition of ashes as a reminder of our oneness with the earth beneath our feet. I will also offer "Ashes on the Go," from 5-7 pm in the Narthex for those who wish to stop in for a brief prayer and ashes.



# ....St. John's News Briefs....

#### **VESTRY RETREAT & GOALS**

Our vestry will have an opportunity to learn from Bishop Bonnie at our annual vestry retreat at our cathedral on Saturday, February 22 from 9 a.m. -4 p.m. Our vestry will also have time that day for some conversation among ourselves, especially regarding possible goals for St. John's for the next 3-5 years. One possible goal is to embark on a major "spring cleaning" of all of St. John's nooks, crannies, closets, and cupboards. Another is to explore new sources of music for congregational singing, and yet another is to re-instate greeters.

#### ST. JOHN'S TO BE A POLLING SITE

For those who missed our Annual Meeting on January 19, know that St. John's has agreed to serve as a polling site for the city of Westland starting with the November 2020 election. Marshall School is slated to be torn down, and our city clerk approached St. John's to see if we would be interested. Unfortunately, we are NOT able to have a bake sale here on election days.

#### VESTRY REDUCED TO SEVEN

In other business, our Annual Meeting also amended our by-laws to set the size of our vestry at seven, elected Jim and Sande Godbout and Geoffrey Smereck as delegates to our diocesan convention. Re-elected to St. John's non-profit Board of Directors Erin Downey Tarnowski (Pres./Treasurer) along with Jeannie Coyne and Don Streeter

#### **USE OF ENDOWMENT IF NEEDED**

Our Annual Meeting also voted to give permission for our Treasurer to withdraw from our investment account up to \$13,000 to meet operating expenses, but only in the event that such funds are needed. In the next few months our vestry consider leasing more of our building during the week to local community groups and organizations to generate revenue.


#### **NEW OFFICERS**
