Getting Our Priorities Straight

"Gracious God, we give you thanks for this day, and for your many blessings which we enjoy."

A wise and faithful Christian once said that two things reveal a person or household's true priorities and the locus of their faith. They are: 1) their calendar; and 2) their checkbook. These two things, our calendars and our checkbooks, reveal our true priorities. They also

reveal where we put our trust. Our calendars reveal what is important enough to spend our time on, and our checkbooks or credit card statements reveal what is important enough to us to spend our money on and where we put our faith.

What does your calendar say about your priorities for the time that God gives you? I hope that it includes at least a few minutes every day for reflection and prayer. I hope that it includes at least an hour a week for corporate worship, here at St. John's either at 11:30 on Wednesdays or on Sunday morning. I hope that your calendar includes time to care for your body through exercise, and time to care for your spirit through relationships and activities with friends and family. How we choose to spend our time matters to God, who is the giver of all time. God blesses each of us with the same amount of time every day and every week.

What does your checkbook or credit card statement say about your priorities for the financial resources with which

God blesses you? We do not have as much control over our financial resources as we may like to have. We do not, for instance, have much control over what we must give to support our local and national services, which we pay in the form of taxes. After that, however, we probably have more control than we think we do. Each of our households gets to decide on discretionary spending, such as for food, clothing, housing, perhaps travel, vacations, and transportation. We can spend a lot on these things, or not so much.

And we can choose to support St. John's either before or after we decide on our discretionary spending. To put it very bluntly, we can give back to God out of what is left-over, or we can give to God first, and decide on our discretionary spending based on what is left-over.

Personally, I find giving to God first and deciding on my discretionary spending second to be very freeing. Yes, it means that I shop at resale shops first, purchase groceries based on what is on sale, and do my best to re-cycle, re-use, and use less. All of these practices are part of my ethic of stewardship, which encompasses all of what I do with all of the blessings that God gives me. Giving to God through the church first deepens my relationship with God, for I am confident, that where my treasure is, there my heart will be also.

I pray the same for you. I pray for your heart and treasure to be firmly fixed on God, the giver of all good gifts.


