




A Bit About Our Tower Bells

When Fr. Mtich came to St. John's, the tower bells (the ones up in the steeple) were a bit off kilter. The clock was 13 minutes off, so everything rang 13 minutes early. Bells for the Sunday Mass were ringing at 9:17 am, with the "warning bell" (as many affectionately call it)ringing at 9:04. Noon and 6:00 pm bells were ringing 13 minutes earlier as well.

Fr. Mitch went through and reprogrammed all the bells so everything rings on time. We're looking into an upgrade. The system we have is going obsolete. More to come on that in the near future.



Bell Schedule

Daily

- The Angelus - 12:00 noon and 6:00 PM

The Angelus is an ancient prayer that was traditionally said at 6:00 am, 12:00 noon, and 6:00 pm. The bells rang for the farmers at the time - time for work, lunch, and time to end work for the day. There Angelus bells ring in 3 sets of 3, then a 1 minute swinging bell. The prayer is as follows:

The Angel of Lord announced to Mary, and she conceived of the Holy Spirit.

(3 Hail Mary's)

"I am the handmaid of the Lord - Let it be doner to me according to thy will."

(3 Hail Mary's)

And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.

(3 Hail Mary's)

This is followed by 3 hymns on the carillon.

- The De Profundus - 8:00 pm daily

The De Profundus is traditionally rung in monasteries and convents, and is used as a daily memorial to those who have gone before us. Traditionally, psalm 130 is prayed at this time (Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord)

- Call to Worship

A one-minute single bell is run 15 minutes before service, with a peal (4 bells ringing together)rung at the time of service.

We have the ability to manually ring bells for extra services, toll bells for memorial services and funerals, and peal bells for weddings. We can also play hymns on the carillon at any time. In the past, like the sanctuary light, for a donation songs were requested to be played after service on a specific Sunday. If there's an interest for that, please talk to Fr. Mitch - and we could look into resurrecting that.


