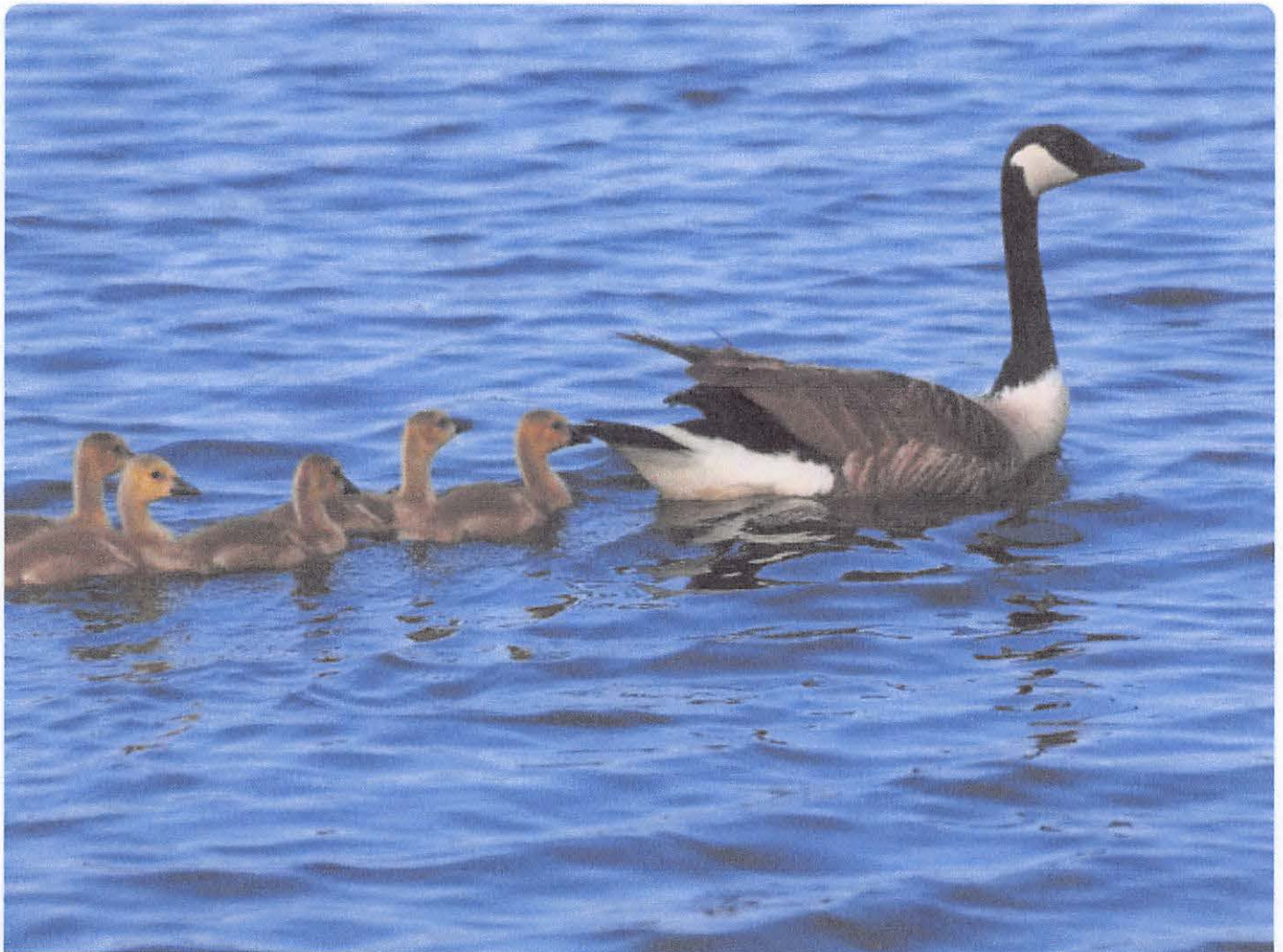
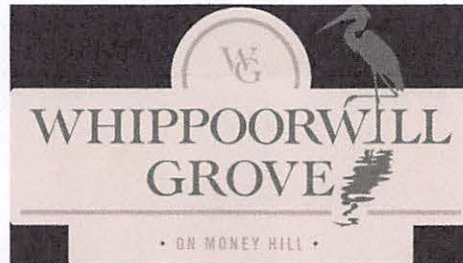


July 2026 Newsletter: Summer Updates & Community Highlights from Whippoorwill Grove!

Parish Mulls Over Dirt Pit

The St. Tammany Parish Zoning Committee meeting on July 7, 2026 was held to discuss the rezoning of 53 acres on Highway 1083 from residential to light industrial for the purpose of putting a dirt/gravel business at this location. The turnout for this hearing seemed fairly light. Several speakers addressed their concerns especially those residents on Hidden Valley Road off of Highway 1083 that will be nearby. The final decision of this hearing was to postpone the matter based on the request of the applicant to provide the requested environmental and related studies to the St. Tammany Staff before any decision would be made. If you are opposed to this zoning change, you should consider showing up at the next Zoning Committee Meeting. We will keep you apprised of the next Zoning Committee meeting hearing on this project (2026-4652-CP)

New Fishing Flags

When using the lakes or fishing off the levees, you will need the new fishing flags that helps identify you as a resident. The new flags are yellow. As of 8/1/26, these are the only acceptable flags. Contact Trevor Parker 985-750-2099 to get a new flag.

WALKING DOGS WITHOUT A LEASH

VEHICLES ON THE LEVEES

There should never be any golf carts, ATVs or the like on the lake levees. During the last 8" plus of rainfall, there was someone's ATV on the Crane/Cormorant levee. With that amount of rainfall, the levees water levels were higher than normal and a vehicle of any kind adds more pressure to the levee. Fines could be imposed for this type of violation. Please do not drive any vehicle on the levee.

Vandalism Follow-up

The vandalism in our area was a shock to us all. However, the person responsible is making restitution by replacing what was damaged and providing the related labor involved. Several residents have asked about this issue and if you want to obtain more information you can obtain a copy of the sheriff's report at the website - www.govQA.com, request a public records request and put in the date, time and location (June 28, 2026, Osprey (WGI), 3 pm - time report taken)

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
