Chris and I met in 2014 at a time when we were both disenchanted and conflicted by the material world around us. Having both studied and pursued various professional practices, academic endeavors, apprenticeships, and internships nationally and internationally, we expected to feel more fulfilled by the pursuit of knowledge and expertise in the fine arts and applied arts.

As late arrivals to the Generation X digital mindset, we understood what the technological revolution accomplished and what it left behind in its wake. Talking over coffee, we discovered that we were not alone. As we laughed recounting stores of fine art school, design school, and, Chris' graduate program, we easily saw that the way we work and live was in need of a little TLC.

Somehow the contrast between the way we were and the way we have become left more to be desired in both our lives. We found ourselves wondering what it would be like to do something about it; but what could be done? Clearly, the constant pursuit of efficiency and mass consumption threatened any potential market demand for higher quality at a time of more costly materials. This way of life enormously threatened the classic fine art and applied art process.

We wondered as sculptor and designer if it was possible to turn back time in pursuit of what we believed to be the best combination of ancient methods in a modern iteration. How could we do that? Is it even possible? If we start at the stone age, understanding rudimentary processes and raw materials, and then look at modernity, moving through the industrial and technological revolution, and study the arts, architecture, and resulting impressions, we begin to see the gradual shift in our thinking. It is like looking backwards and forward at the same time...standing still just long enough to decide where to go from here.

So we did something about it. We then spent almost six years stumbling methodically through a re-invention and scaling process, blindly pursuing a new way of thinking about materials. Laughing over many of Chris' small batch home-brews, we endeavored to do the impossible and smile all the way.

In each small town that we lived in while trying to find the right place for us, we discovered something vital to our understanding of what it takes to rebuild our current culture. We found friends in unexpected places who helped shape our way of operating and helped us hone into our way of choosing materials for the built environment.

In 2016, we settled in LaGrange Georgia, a small southern town full of people who understand innately the value of making something with their own hands. They remember when tradespeople in the U.S. were highly regarded as experts in the days before the internet informed us of the best and most useful way to do things. We remembered together what it was like to listen to the experts.

So LaGrange is a full participant in our story. We may not always understand each other here in LaGrange but the nice thing is we don't have to; it's our differences that keep life interesting and makes us well-rounded. An environment like this gave us room to climb a steep learning curve into a baby manufacturing business.

Purpose.



Our philosophy starts at the Stone Age and dives into what intrinsic beauty means in today's world.


