The Lawn Cross

(One of the 75th Anniversary Projects Completed)

As you may know in recent years the tree that used to be in the yard near the Sanctuary died. Then, one of our members carved the trunk of the tree into a cross. It has been there for several years, until the roots of the tree rotted so much, the cross was not able to stand.

Josh Grundmann, one of our members, among other attributes, is a creative person. One morning as he was preparing for worship, he looked intently at the outside of the hymnal in the rack before him. The gold cross caught his eye. He investigated the hymnal and turned to page ix which has information about the cover to find out more about the design of the cross. God worked in Josh's heart and creative ideas started to gel.

The explanation states "The dark, innermost portion of the cross is a reminder of the darkness of Good Friday, when our Lord humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross' (Phil. 2:8). The prominent gold leaf cross is a reminder of the resurrection of our Lord. God raised Him 'from the dead and gave Him glory, so that [our] faith and hope are in God.' (1Peter 1:21."

Josh's thoughts and ideas were then put into action, and he created and constructed the cross out of steel. His dad, John, also assisted and his Aunt Diana assisted by painting the cross. It was installed in the location of the previous cross, as we know it. "The Lawn Cross" was then dedicated on Sunday morning, November 16, 2025, before our 75th Anniversary Celebration worship service in the Sanctuary. It is a beautiful and welcoming site to remind us of and welcome our worshipers into the church to join us for worship. Thanks Josh, and to the Grundmann family for making this all happen to the Glory of God!

We Were so Blessed by God to Celebrate the Beginnings of The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Midwest City, Oklahoma!


Most of us were not here when it all began. Many that attended our Celebration events were not here for our 50th Celebration twenty-five years ago. Hopefully, you have had the opportunity to see the PowerPoint presentations over the decades that were presented before the 8 a.m. worship service and were also available via Livestream on our website mylutheran.church. We have the decades of presentations now available on a flash drive if you would like to see it again or for the first time. Just let the church office know.

Our first event of the weekend was the **Confirmation Reunion** on Saturday from 11 a.m. – 2 p.m. We were wonderfully blessed to have sixty attendees with thirty-five of those being Confirmands from previous years. It was great to see how the Confirmands connected with former classmates, previous and later years' classmates, etc. We took them on a tour of the church including the many stained-glass windows and other appointments in the Sanctuary. After lunch, they broke into decades of time and shared their stories of what happened in some of their classes, how they enjoyed being in the Youth Group activities, etc. We heard many stories in their lives of how God guided and directed them when they were just teens.



That evening we held a **Meet and Greet** time to meet past members and Pastors that have served here as well as those Sons of the congregation that have become Pastors. Approximately twenty-five attended and enjoyed the conversation, food, and fellowship.

Sunday was a big day. As mentioned previously, we had the **Dedication of the Lawn Cross** which was very appropriate to begin our big day of **Celebration**. We asked those worshiping with us to sign our 75th Anniversary Guest Register. We had 216 guests sign. It was wonderful to see the Sanctuary full of people and have so many worship with us. We were blessed to have Nathan Pierce who plans to attend Seminary next fall, read the Psalm for the day, and two Sons of the congregation to read the Old Testament and New Testament readings. They were Rev. Donald Hefta and Rev. Ernie Lassman. Rev. Dr. Joe Meyer, former pastor from 2005-2008 was the Proclaimer for the day. His sermon focused on our Bible verse for our 75th Anniversary, "My Sheep hear my voice . . . And I know them, and they follow me." John 10:27.



To augment the worship service the **Children from our School** sang two selections. "Make a Joyful Noise to the Lord" and "I Am Jesus Little Lamb." Mrs. Grace Rohwer, Music Director, accompanied them with her guitar and directed them to sing.



The Adult Sanctuary **Choir** also sang. "Lead Me Like a Shepherd" was the name of the selection. Jacob Bowen, Elder read some Scripture aloud to lead into the selection sang by the Choir. Holy Communion was also offered for the worshipers to partake in.



- After the joyful and uplifting worship service, all were invited to the Family Life Center to be served the Thanksgiving Meal that was prepared by the members of the 75th Anniversary Committee.
- The attendees were then seated at white clothed with royal blue table runners 'tables of eight. We served 224 people who graciously enjoyed the scrumptious meal.
- We also had a silent auction taking place during this time. An array of items was available with many shoppers participating. Also included were two \$500 gift cards to purchase tickets for a winner at the end of the day.
- Royce Junghanns served as Emcee for the 75th Anniversary Celebration Program.
- We were blessed with Linda Jones being able to speak to us and share what it was like in 1950 when the church began. At that time, Linda was only six months old. She was in her mother's arms (Laurine Goode-Schulz) when the photo was taken showing the original thirty-four members how The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church began.
- We had several Pastors speak or send a letter who had ties to our beginnings. Rev. Rick Mensing, served 1983-1991, Rev. Kevin Yoakum, (letter) who served from 1998-2003; Rev. Dr. Joe Meyer who served from 2005-2008, and Rev. Ron Simpson, who has been serving since 2009. Also, a "Roast" regarding Pastor A. Gerald Quiram 1968 1994 celebrating his 20th year in the ministry.
- We also had many Sons of the Congregation that have become Pastors to bring greetings or send a letter. Rev Ernie Lassman, Rev. Eric Allyn (letter), Rev. 












A Night in Bethlehem

Of course, Eden Clinic loves receiving material donations to pass along to mom's and families in their parenting programs.



"First"



Colossians 1:13-20

He [God] has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through Him and for Him. And He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together. And He is the Head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything He might be preeminent. For in Him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through Him to reconcile to Himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of His cross.

I really love this passage for its descriptions of Jesus. How in the world did Paul manage to pack in so much good stuff about Him? It would take days to even start to unpack all the meaning in this passage!

But the one thing Paul keeps stressing is that Jesus is first. He is the uncreated God, through whom all things were created, and to whom they all belong—and yet He is also truly human, and thus the highest and most glorious, the first of all creation. He is first in the church, as our Head—and He is the first to rise from the dead, never to die again. In so many ways, Jesus is first—highest—most glorious. And then we come down with a thump to this: "making peace by the blood of His cross."

Because Jesus is also first in another way—first in lovingkindness and mercy, beyond anything I could have ever imagined before I knew Him. Because Jesus knew what it would cost Him to bring us home to God, and He still did it. Pain? Shame? Fear and grief and abandonment? Jesus took it all, so that we might be at peace with God, forgiven and beloved. And He was not sorry.

And now that Jesus has risen from the dead, we have life in Him forever. We will never lose Him, or He us. Because Jesus is restoring all of God's broken creation—not just us, but everything. When He is finished, there will be no more crying or grief or sorrow or death. We will be with Him in that new creation, and we will be full of joy. And we will celebrate Jesus, who is first in all things—and first in our hearts forever.

WE PRAY: Dear Lord, You are so high, and yet You loved me and came to save me. Thank You. Amen.

Reflection Questions:

- 1. Do you know anyone who is "number one" in his or her field?
- 2. Would you expect someone who is first to make himself last? Why or why not?
- 3. Why does God call Jesus "beloved"? Would you use that name for Him?
