From The Pastor

Reformation Day is sometimes treated as merely a nod to history for those who claim Luther's legacy. But the great Reformation is not about recalling a hero. It is about reclaiming the Gospel in our own time. The once and eternal call is to "fear God and give Him glory" (Revelation 14:7). This fear is nothing less than faith, although it is more. It is respect for the Law that condemns our sin and trust in the Gospel that forgives us. It is reverence before the God who could have settled for being just but instead chose to be merciful. With joy, we claim the heritage and enjoin the responsibility of keeping this faith pure, vigorously proclaiming this faith both within and outside the company of the faithful.



It is easy to underestimate the darkness of that time prior to the Reformation. It is just as easy to underestimate the darkness in our own day. On this day, we do not simply recall an event but the work of God recalling His Church to the eternal Gospel. We proclaim with clarity that justification by grace through faith is not some Lutheran quirk but is the message of Christ, affirmed by Paul and kept in trust by the Church down through the centuries as our greatest treasure. Just as the world long ago needed to hear the Church proclaim in an unwavering voice Jesus Christ and His payment for our sin, so does our world long for the true freedom bestowed by grace and grasped by faith.

10 Acres Offer Stepping Stone to Christian Future

... 'About one-third of the 150 communicant members were received into the church as adults, many of them having no church ties before.

All adults joining go through a course in principles of Christian faith before being received into the church. They not only study the Bible and doctrines of their church; they learn about the doctrines of other churches.



"We believe this makes their church membership intelligent and meaningful to them," the pastor said.

New members often ask how the new church has been able to progress so much in only a few years.

"Like a TV show, a new grocery store or anything else, we have a sponsor," the pastor answers. "In our case the sponsor is Lutherans all through Oklahoma and the United States, who have given us aid."

Business of the church is handled through a voters assembly, made up of male communicants. A church council drawn from it elects officers.

One of the organizations is the Lutheran Laymen's League, which internationally sponsors The Lutheran Hour. Locally, it is organized for Christian fellowship, education and service.

The Ruth Guild, connected with the Lutheran Women's Missionary League, is the local women's organization.

The Youth league has a program built around Christian fellowship, with study and special service projects included.

Due to crowding of the sanctuary for most services, the church is considering starting dual services each Sunday morning. Altogether, the Good Shepherd serves about 370 souls, from the cradle roll on up.

"We hope to get an education director someday soon," the pastor said. "When we do, he will decide on the use of our property for ball fields and other recreation."

Plans are to build the new church, with all parking off the street, on the south part of the plot, facing Air Depot. Educational buildings then will be constructed on the north side, leaving the back of the acreage for other uses.

Whatever the future brings, the emphasis will remain on religious education, Pastor Groteluschen declared.

"You can't build character without religion," he said. "We strive to prepare our boys and girls for a life of service to God and their fellow men."

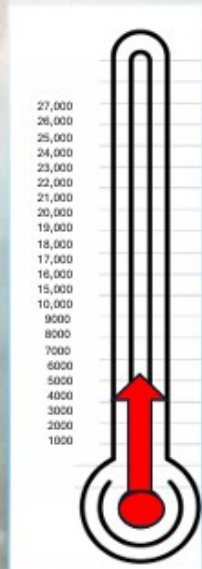

Work and Keep

***“The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it”
(Genesis 2:15).***

Genesis chapters one and two are familiar to us. We know them best as the Creation Account. Chapter one is where we hear the familiar, “let there be... and there was” directives. Chapter two gives us the account of Adam (the man) being formed from the “Adamah” (the dust) and becoming a living being when he receives the breath of life in his nostrils. Because of this, it would be quite easy to simply lump these two chapters into the category of creation accounts.

But do not be too hasty in this! While these two chapters do faithfully relate to us the account of creation, they also give us the creation of the “office” of steward. The man, created in the image of God in Genesis 1 and formed from the dust in Genesis 2, is created for a distinct purpose.

He is created to be a steward of the perfect and beautiful creation that the Lord has made! In fact, this is THE reason that man was made.

He — and we — were created in the image of God to be stewards of God’s creation.

This purpose is spelled out in verse 15 of Genesis 2. The steward has one job, with two purposes. It is fitting that in the month that our nation marks Labor Day, we consider the task of steward. The first purpose of the job of steward is to work. The steward is the caretaker of the Garden. Being a steward is work! Before the fall into sin, this was not an onerous task. But it was an active thing.

Imagine being a farmer in the Garden of Eden! Work would be only harvest. No plowing. No planting. No cultivating. No weeding. The perfect garden that the Lord had made would simply produce automatically to provide for man, woman, and all living beings!

But there is a second task in verse fifteen. The word “keep” is not just a synonym for work. This second task is related to defending. This garden, holy by virtue of its being called into existence by a holy God, needed to be defended.

Here is where the vocation of steward becomes priestly. The steward was to defend the perfect and holy garden from that which was unholy. Later in the Old Testament, this was the task of the priests in the tabernacle and temple. They were to defend with their lives the Holy of Holies. This too is the labor of stewardship. It is a labor that calls the steward to be willing to put the garden before life!

Stewardship was always work. It only got burdensome after the original steward, Adam, failed to defend the garden from the alien word of the serpent. But this was not a failure of harvest. It was a failure to defend the garden! As a result, all work that followed that failure became burdensome.

The steward failed but was never fired. That is why we have such an issue with stewardship to this day. We continue to live out a pre-fall vocation in a fallen world as failed stewards. That is why we in the church need to be reminded of our vocational call to be stewards. We so easily forget that this world is not ours to do with as we please. Nothing is ours. We are but stewards entrusted with managing the creation for the glory of God and the benefit of the neighbor.

It is a daunting task. But it is the one to which we have been called. We cannot do it on our own. Apart from the grace of God shared with us through Jesus, we would be burdened to the point of temporal and eternal death. But the Holy Spirit calls us by the Gospel! This Gospel connects us to the fertile garden of Christ’s Work on our behalf. Now we are stewards of that grace! The Holy Spirit works this in and through us today and every day.

This is the work of the church. It is also the work of the individual steward. The Lord has placed us in the “garden” with the same twofold purpose: work and keep! Enjoy your labor.

For in the Lord, our labor is never in vain!

- Part 4 – Calling

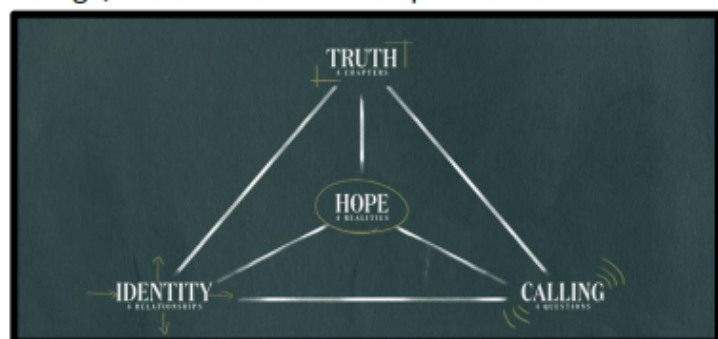

10. Is God “saving” our physical body or “saving” our eternal souls?

What makes us fearful or afraid? anxious?

11. World Wide in 2025 #1 fear à Crime and Violence (32% throughout 30 countries)
12. Inflation à (31%)
13. 2025 is a “rare” year → a “perfect square year”(45 x 45 = 2025) and has been preceded by:
 - a. Pandemic, wildfires, flooding, widespread feeling of unease and anticipation about potential political, economic and environmental challenges
 - b. Anticipate the coming of the “End of the Age” → Jesus’ Return

Kinds of Fear - Consequences & Condemnation

What makes us fearful? afraid? anxious? Common Fears (phobias) à can cause Panic Attacks

Acrophobia – fear of heights, falling Glossophobia – fear of public speaking

Claustrophobia – fear of enclosed spaces (trapped in an elevator) I’ve experienced – Have you?

Aerophobia – fear of flying Fear of Animals (including: bats, sharks, wasps, mountain lions)

Arachnophobia – fear of spiders Ophidiophobia – fear of snakes

Fear of going to a Dentist/Doctors (iatrophobia) Fear of Change

Fear of not being good enough Fear of the Unknown

Fear of Crowds Driving Fear of Failure

Fear of Physical Harm Fear of Thunder/Lightning Falls (falling off bed during sleep)

Darkness Blood, injury, broken bones, ladders

Extinction – Death, Abandonment (separation, rejection, isolation, loss)

Disappointing others Inadequacy; not measuring up to expectations, being incompetent, failing

Feeling left out Social Anxiety Mutilation Shame, humiliation, loss of self

Loss of Autonomy – being controlled, trapped, or loss of freedom (going to nursing home/hospital)

God encourages us to trust Him. Jesus paid the price to show us how much He Loves Each of Us.

We are Children of God – “Be Not Afraid, even in the midst of trials and tribulations; **He is with us”** Amen!

John 4:18 **“There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear.** For fear has to do with **punishment**, and **whoever fears has not been perfected in love.”**
