and talk face to face, so that our joy may be complete" (2 John 12). Centuries later, we have the blessed opportunity to learn from these servants of the Lord through the gift of their writings.

In all of sacred writing, there is one special volume. It is the Book of Life. Paul alludes to it as he writes to the Christians at Philippi, referring to "my fellow workers, whose names are in the book of life" (Philippians 4:3). Hymnwriter Benjamin Schmolck links that writing to the blessings of Holy Baptism as he reflects on the naming of a child in the Sacrament: "Write the name we now have given; Write it in the book of heaven!" (*LSB* 592:5). As he describes the heavenly future of God's redeemed people, John hears from the throne of God the promise, "Behold, I am making all things new" and is directed to "write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true" (Revelation 21:5). Sacred writing blesses us throughout our life and guides us to that final time beyond time, beautifully described by Charitie L. de Chenez in her hymn text "Before the Throne of God Above." Together we sing stanzas 1 and 2 of the hymn.





Part 2: Sacred Writing


The writers of the sacred Scriptures followed the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in penning their words. A number of Paul's letters bear his personal touch, as is underscored by the words, "I, Paul, write this greeting with my own hand. This is the sign of genuineness in every letter of mine; it is the way I write. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all" (2 Thessalonians 3:17–18). Sometimes writing took the place of a face-to-face meeting with one of God's writers. In the concluding section of his Second Epistle, John writes, "Though I have much to write to you, I would rather not use paper and ink. Instead I hope to come to you






THEME SEQUENCE

Part 1: Sacred Writing

The middle subject in the traditional trio of "reading, writing, arithmetic" is writing. Sacred writing and sacred writings are central to our life with God. In Deuteronomy, we read that God had chosen writing as a special means of communication with His people when they were given the commandments through Moses on Mount Sinai. In Exodus, we read that "The tablets were the work of God, and the writing was the writing of God, engraved on the tablets" (Exodus 32:16). Moses counseled the children of Israel to take the commands of God to heart and to "write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates" (Deuteronomy 6:9). The Israelite leader Joshua, who succeeded Moses, was told by God, "This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it" (Joshua 1:8). The written Word of God has always been powerful as it has guided the people of God.

After Jesus had completed His earthly ministry, God's communicating through sacred writings continued, building on the ancient writings that had supported the people of God through many challenging centuries. In writing to his young assistant Timothy, Paul stated, "from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 3:15). The apostles and evangelists knew the importance of writing things down for believers in Christ. John writes in his First Epistle, "that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ. And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete" (1 John 1:3–4). In the mission hymn "Spread the Reign of God the Lord," the Word is described as both spoken and written. Together we sing the first stanza of the hymn.




