

CITY OF FLORENCE  
REGULAR MEETING OF MAYOR AND BOARD  
JUNE 17, 2025

The Governing Authorities of the city of Florence met in their regularly scheduled meeting set for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday in June, June 17, 2025 at 6:30 p.m. at city hall located at 203 College Street in Florence, Mississippi.

Initially present were Mayor Morris, Aldermen Banks, Grantham, Gunn, Helms and Herrin.

Mayor Morris called the Meeting to order and announced a quorum.

Alderman Gunn gave the invocation.

A Motion was made by Alderman Helms, seconded by Alderman Gunn to approve payment of invoice number M25017-D-01 Final to Maintenance Systems, Inc. in the amount of \$12,070.93 for emergency repairs to the Florence Main Street Water Line, repairs being declared an emergency due to the need to supply continued water service to the community. The Motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

Upon recommendation of Street Director, David Myers a Motion was made by Alderman Banks, seconded by Alderman Herrin to approve the quote of A-1 Construction in the amount of \$20,500.00 to frame in the public works maintenance/equipment building, the lowest and best of two quotes received as follows:

The Motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

Upon recommendation of Community Development Director, Joel Sims a Motion was made by Alderman Helms, seconded by Alderman Herrin to approve signage for Star Services, Inc. as submitted by Budget Signs, LLC. The Motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

A Motion was made by Alderman Herrin, seconded by Alderman Banks to appoint Alderman Trey Gunn as MML voting delegate and to appoint Alderman Brian Grantham as the alternate voting delegate. The Motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

Alderman Mason Herrin left the Meeting.

Upon recommendation of City Engineer Tim Parker, a Motion was made by Alderman Grantham, seconded by Alderman Gunn to approve the bid of Thornton Construction Company, Inc. in the amount of \$156,160.00 for the Hwy. 49 Eagle Post Road Sanitary Sewer Additions Phase 3, the lowest and best of six bids received as follows:

A Motion was made by Alderman Helms, seconded by Alderman Gunn to approve the mid-month claims docket. The Motion was carried by a unanimous vote.

A Motion was made by Alderman Herrin, seconded by Alderman Grantham to approve the Minutes of June 10, 2025. The Motion was carried by a unanimous vote.
