The winner of 'One to Watch' will receive a place on 'Women Leaders' course at Cranfield University (worth over £4,000) in addition to selecting one of the Meat Business Committee as a mentor for 12 months.

'One to Watch' is an annual prize awarded to a female aged under 30 who has been working within the meat industry for up to 5 years. The prize has been established by Meat Business Women in order to assist with the objectives to inspire, network and grow the pipeline of female talent within sector. Growing that pipeline of talent will make our industry more attractive to others, especially females. Evidence from McKinsey, Co-op Asset Management and Peterson Institute demonstrates that companies with gender diverse boards achieve superior financial returns, are more resilient to groupthink and benefit from women represented at all levels of management.

This prize is for an inspirational female who has made an incredible impact in her place of work in a very short period and the winner receives more than just a trophy.

Application process:

Entries must include a completed entry form with the details requested. Please consider the judging criteria given assume that the judges know nothing about the individual, their role and company. All entries must be emailed to meatbusinesswomen@hotmail.com by 5pm on Friday 31st August 2018. The awards are free to enter. All information provided in your entry will be kept confidential.
