

Common Household Poisons/Hazards For Pets

Algae from ponds - Blue/green

Antifreeze

Batteries-Alkaline/rechargeable/watch

Chemical strippers/cleaners

Citronella candles

Cocoa mulch

Coins-pennies/nickels (copper and zinc if swallowed)

Compost pile

Fertilizers -Lawn/plant

Fly Bait

Garbage (obstructions, stomach upsets and bacterial/mold toxins)

Household cleaners in a bucket/spill

Iron-esp from excess supplements

Lead-paint/batteries

Mothballs

Permethrin (pet store flea treatments for dogs, if used on cats)

Pesticides-lawn granules as well as liquid

Petroleum distillates/cleaners (paint thinners, turpentine, varsol etc)

Pot Pori liquid

Rat poisons

Road salt and Ice melts

Slug bait (metaldehyde)

Strychnine

Toilet bowl cleaners/Drain cleaners/ other household cleaners - Bleach/ammonia

MEDICATION

Aspirin ASA (depends on dose)

Advil/ Motrim (Ibuprofen)

Tylenol (Acetaminophen)-esp cats

Some heart, antidepressant, sleeping/other human meds

Amphetamines/barbiturates/cocaine /marijuana , LSD

FOOD

Alcohol

Avocado

Chocolate

Coffee/ tea/ Energy drinks (caffeinated drinks)

Garlic /Onions(depends on dose)/Leek/Chinese Chives

Green Tomatoes and Potatoes

Grapes/ Raisins/ currents (depends on dose)

Macadamia nuts

Moldy Foods

Oxolate containing foods (spinach, rhubarb, bran flakes, beets, beans)

Raw dough /eggs/meat

Salt

Xylitol in sugar free chewing gum and candy

Some fruit stems/seeds and pits

PLANTS/FLOWERS

Azalea/Rhododendron

Bulbs-most plants-Amaryllis/tulip/iris/narcissus

Castor beans/plant

Chrysanthemum

Clematis (stomach upset)

Crocus (autumn)

Cyclamen

Dieffenbachia

Foxglove

Horse chestnut

Hops

Kalanchoe- common house gift basket plant

Lilies-common bouquet (especially Easter, Tiger and Day lilies)

Mistletoe

Morning Glory

Mushrooms-wild (some cause stomach upset, some cause liver failure)

Oleander

Philodendron

Poinsettia (stomach upset only)

Yew evergreen shrubs-eg Japanese Yew

HAZARDS

Batteries

Bones-hard ones and ones that splinter/break

Cow/animal hooves/ Deer Antlers and other hard

chews made for aggressive chewers

Some rawhides, pigs ears, bully sticks/bull penis-

Salmonella/E coli/Methacillin resistant bacteria)

Jerky Treats (esp Chicken/Poultry - made in China)

Certain Commercially made treats (ASK US)

Polyurethane expanding glues (Bulldog PL, Gorilla)

String, tinsel, dental floss, carpet fuzz swallowed as a string

Turkey/ham (rich fat/ seasoning)

Yeasty dough

Silica gel in cat litter

Other toys and objects that can be **swallowed inadvertently or broken into smaller pieces** by your pet (be wary of even rope toys, door stopper tips, ear/rubber plugs, telephone or electrical cords being chewed on!). Use common sense as with kids-keep them out of reach
