# WHAT IS NEIGHBOURHOOD \_\_\_WATCHSA?

#### 'Mum" SMS text

This scam is continuing to catch parents out. It starts when you receive an SMS message to "Mum" or "Dad" from your 'child' asking for an urgent money transfer. Simply call them on a number you have previously spoken to them on, to confirm the message, even if that is the number of the phone the scammer is reporting lost, stolen or damaged. Be aware.

### **Beating Graffiti**

Rapid and Continual Removal of graffiti is one of the best deterrents to stop graffiti returning to the site.

**Painting over the graffiti** is most effective way to remove the graffiti.

When the graffiti is removed by the "paint out method" be sure to match the colour of paint being used - as close as possible to the existing colour of the fence prior to the graffiti damaged.

Be sure to paint the graffiti over in a "block" formation and DO NOT follow the lines of the tag.

#### **OPERATION VULNERABLE**

Operation Vulnerable, was conducted statewide between Monday 9 September and Sunday 15 September 2024, with a focus on the safety of pedestrians, cyclists, motorcyclists and escooter riders.

<u>South Australia Police detected 593 road safety offences</u> that put vulnerable road users at risk during this road safety operation aimed at curbing unsafe road behaviours.

Sadly, one life was lost, and three vulnerable road users were seriously injured during the operation period.

During Operation Vulnerable police screened road users for drink and drug driving offences catching 65 drink drivers and 58 drug drivers.

Motorcyclists were detected for 39 offences: including 10 instances of unsafe lane behaviours, 8 speeding offences, and four riders on unregistered motorcycles.

Of note were 315 cyclists found committing road safety breaches, including 178 failing to wear a helmet. Another 113 cyclists were breached for riding with improper lighting and others for using a mobile phone whilst riding.

Eight e-scooter riders were detected offending, including not wearing a helmet.

Also, 72 pedestrians came to police attention, including 30 pedestrians crossing on a red pedestrian light, 10 crossing the road within 20 metres of a pedestrian crossing and 32 other offences. These included staying on the road longer than necessary and not crossing by the safest and shortest route.

Operation Vulnerable also focussed on motorists who put vulnerable road users at risk. Police caught 36 motorists for offences, including 7 who failed to give way to pedestrians whilst turning or conducting a Uturn, and 22 motorists stopping or driving in a bicycle lane.

Traffic Services Branch Officer in Charge, Superintendent Darren Fielke, said all road users play a role in keeping our roads safe.

"The details matter, especially when using the roads. E-scooter riders must wear a helmet, motorists must stay off bicycle lanes and pedestrians must cross safely and quickly.

We encourage you to take heed of this information as Supt Fielke said, "It's the responsibility of each road user to learn the road rules. There are rules for a reason, because the rules work to keep all road users, including vulnerable road users safe".


#### LOCK IT OR LOSE IT!
