Recently the Minister for Road Safety, the Hon. Tom Kenyon MP announced the Towards Zero Together Strategy for 2020. In his words this is a Strategy about YOU.

It's about the driver, every motor cyclist, every pedestrian, every cyclist all having respect for each other. It's about thinking safely and changing our behaviour every time we venture onto the roads.

It's about admitting to ourselves that creeping over the speed limit -even just a little - is not acceptable, that driving after drinking is just not on, that running the red light is risky, dangerous driving.

It's about not taking drugs and driving, not texting, taking or making a mobile phone call in the driver's seat.

This strategy aims to reduce our annual road toll to less than the shocking 80 fatalities and 800 serious injuries by 2020.

We can collectively all make a difference—we all need to think of that old saying - Safety First every time we venture onto the roads- We all want to come home safely to our families each day. It's up to everyone to try harder to make this happen.

On Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> May The Hut Community Centre opened its doors to celebrate the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of providing services to The Hills Community.

During 1979, the small but active congregation of the Aldgate church, (part of the Uniting Church in Australia) on Fenchurch Road,

decided to explore opportunities to address the needs of isolated people within the Hills. A small, under-utilised, 2 roomed transportable building on the church grounds known as the hut, was revamped and opened to the community with the object of attempting to provide for all and any needs which became apparent. The Hut continues to have the focus of addressing social isolation and connecting people to their community, 40 years on.

More than 500 people attended throughout the day and participated in come 'n' try activities in mosaics, leadlighting, and woodwork. There were also plenty of entertainment and activities for the kids, with gumboot planting, face painting, bouncy castle, Hills Toy Library activities and Twig and Sticks Nature Play.

The day was also an opportunity to have the opening of Teetaka Ila, The Platform Community Gardens with Josh Teague MP officiating.

The development of the garden was funded by the Department of the Premier and Cabinet and the 'Fund my neighbourhood' program and driven by a team of community volunteers.

After extensive community consultation and many hours of work by a team of dedicated volunteers, the platform gardens is now open for the community to enjoy. Teetaka Ila means 'Sit and Share place'. This is what we hope this space will be for the community, a place to relax, learn, grow and contribute.

# RAA Friday is the favourite day for car thieves to strike

Thieves prefer Fridays when it comes to stealing your car, according to latest figures obtained by RAA Insurance.

RAA Insurance is urging drivers to be vigilant to avoid becoming a victim of car crime and has released a list of safety tips to minimise the risks to their vehicles.

According to the National Motor Vehicle Theft Reduction Council, of which RAA is a member, a total of 527 vehicles were stolen on a Friday - more than any other day of the week - in the 12 months to the end of September 2018.

That's an average of around 10 cars each Friday over this period. Friday thieves were most active between 4pm-8pm when a total of 155 vehicles were stolen.

It was also revealed more vehicles were stolen in March (319) than any other month during this period.

"Having your car stolen is a major inconvenience and, if you're not insured, a serious financial setback," RAA Insurance Claims Manager Hayley Cain said.

"That's why we encourage all motorists to take precautions to reduce their chance of having their car stolen or broken into."

Ms Cain said the figures showed about two thirds of the 3002 vehicles stolen in this period were for "short term use" – or joy riding – and the rest for "financial gain" such as accessing spare parts.

"It's about opportunities and there are many more people parking in public while out and about on a Friday evening.

"This might also explain why March – with all its associated events like the festival and supercar race – is the most common month for stealing cars."

The total theft figures for SA in the 12 months to September were consistent with the annual average reported to police during the past four years, Ms Cain said.

Here's what you can do to reduce the chances of having your car stolen or broken into:

- Park in a garage or carport whenever possible.
- If you must park on the road, leave your car in a well-lit area and preferably have an alarm fitted.
- Install sensor lights in your driveway as a deterrent.
- Always lock your vehicle.
- Remove items of value from sight.
- If you don't have a car alarm, use a steering wheel lock.
- Don't put all your valuables in the boot, most trunks are easily accessible.






Neighbourhood Watch areas work against crime: the public are the eyes and ears for the police in our neighbourhood.

1.17/3/19 Woodland CI, Aldgate Theft of sunglasses from car. Nil damage.


### Serious Criminal Trespass
