They will be conducted from 6pm to 7pm in the Regent Room to provide 1.5m physical distancing required due to COVID 19.

For your information, in November 2020 City of Adelaide announced a restructure that has resulted in the three Community Centres (Box Factory, South West and North Adelaide) being coordinated by one person.

This will no doubt impact on the systems and processes that have operated in the past.

The most significant being that the Box Factory will not be staffed from 4pm to 7pm Monday to Friday. Although it can be hired for use during these times it is currently unclear how we can access keys and we will no longer be able to use the centre as the pick-up point for the distribution of the NHW newsletter. We are awaiting for further information at the time of printing.

All City of Adelaide Libraries are open with no change to their normal operating hours other than to accommodate the current State Government COVID-19 requirements. The Adelaide South West Community Centre has now reopened. Further information re times and programs can be found on the City of Adelaide website.

Home Safety

SAPOL takes this opportunity to recommend the following crime prevention tips:

- ensure appropriate keyed locks are fitted to all doors and windows
- even when you are outside, be sure to lock all doors and windows
- install a quality security screen door to the front and rear doors
- do not leave valuables in obvious places
- · consider installing a safe
- use an engraver, ultraviolet (UV) pen or microdot technology to mark property
- mark your valuables with your driver's licence number, prefixed 'S' for South Australia, e.g. S123456.

SA Police issue scam warning after fraudster impersonating NBN calls cybercrime unit

South Australian police have issued a warning about a new scam targeting Adelaide locals, after the force's own cybercrime unit was among the recipients of one of the deceptive phone calls.

SA Police said scammers were ringing Adelaide landlines, advising recipients that their computers had been hacked and directing them to a website imitating the National Broadband Network (NBN).

"There is an NBN scam currently cycling through Adelaide landline numbers, and the Financial and Cybercrime Investigation Branch (FCIB), who investigate such scams, were one of the numbers to receive a call," police said in a statement.

To better understand the fraudulent operation, a member of the FCIB using secure software followed the caller's instructions and was led to a "poorly designed" website.

"The obvious indicator that this website is not affiliated with the NBN is that the text preceding the '.com' is weebly — a webhosting site," police said.

The officer was then told to carry out steps which resulted in remote

access software being downloaded.

"The caller tried to reassure us that the software would help fix our internet problem," police said.

"We informed the caller that we couldn't open the program, so he had us click on [other] buttons, which attempted to download further executable programs.


"After we kept experiencing problems, the caller terminated the call."

Police suspect the scammer was attempting to gain access to personal information, including passwords for online banking.

They urged the public not to engage with scammers, and said the incident demonstrated that "no-one is safe from receiving scam robocalls, not even the police".

"Our advice to the community is to not download software that you are not familiar with, and never at the direction of someone over the phone," police said.

"If you receive a call and cannot be certain who you are speaking to, hang up the phone and call the organisation back on a known, reputable number."



Overpayment scam targets vehicle sellers

WA ScamNet has received a spike in reports about overpayment scams targeting consumers selling goods through online classified adverts with recent incidents involving scammers using false identities, such as a driver's licence and targeting car sellers.

Overpayment scams usually work by getting you to 'refund' a scammer who has sent you too much money for an item you are selling or to forward the additional funds to someone else to cover costs such as shipping.

These scammers are contacting people selling vehicles on websites like Gumtree and carsales.com.au, and then requesting they contact them via email to discuss the sale of the vehicle.

They then ask the seller to accept an additional amount of money from them which is to be forwarded by the seller on their behalf via Western Union or MoneyGram in order to pay for the shipping of the vehicle.

The seller then receives a fake PayPal email stating the funds have been transferred and will be placed into the nominated account once a receipt is provided showing the transfer of the payment to the courier for shipping.

KNOW THE SCAM "I don't believe everything I'm told, do you?" Anyone can be a target for scammers - so be on the look out. Scammers use sophisticated methods to take your money. To learn how to PROTECT YOURSELF and KNOW THE SCAN visit www.scamwatch.gov.au Report all seams to the police assistance line by calling 131 444.

The scammers often make claims like:

"I'm ok with the condition as described on the advert."

"I work on North West Shelf in the Rowley Sub-basin in Perth and the reception here is terrible. We do not have access to phone at the moment, which is why I contacted you with internet messaging facility."

They also claim the car is a surprise and is to be delivered elsewhere such as to Darwin, and then request the following:

"I am more than happy to go ahead with the purchase, that is ok with me, please do provide me with your paypal email address or bank details so that I can go ahead with the transfer to your bank account via my paypal, can you also give me the pickup postcode? so that I can get a definite quote from the carriers. As regards the papers, all I will need is a receipt, the rego will have to be done in NT, so there will be no use for the existing Reg and RWC."

Tips for sellers

- Never pay money via wire transfer to help a customer access the goods or services you are selling;
- Be cautious when dealing with customers only via email or who claim to be overseas or interstate - independently verify who you are dealing with before sending any money or goods. If doubtful, then do not proceed with the sale;
- Be sceptical if normal banking processes are not available; and
- When accepting a payment, check with the bank or PayPal to make sure it is legitimate before proceeding with the sale.




