COMMITTEE ELECTED

At **our AGM meeting in June** the following were re-elected; Tim Young-Coordinator, Lorraine Young-Secretary, Christine Byrnes-Treasurer. Luis Gugliette was elected as Deputy Chair and Ruth Deschepper as Newsletter Coordinator. Sincere thanks to Rex Langton who generously stood aside from the Deputy Coordinator role after many years of dedicated service. Fortunately Rex remains a valued area member.

We have been provided with the following information from Jennifer West from the Council with regard to **shredding of documents**. The Box Factory Community Centre have indicated that they have a shredder available for local community use on site. At the **Eastern District meeting** held 23 May Phil Gurr spoke about the attempt by NHW to be more inclusive through communication with community groups.

There is a demonstrated link between **loneliness and crime**. Members were asked to think about how this could work in our area. It was suggested that we could combine our efforts with the South East Corner Residents Association if we decided to look at opportunities in the community.

Some **SAPOL** activities ongoing in the district are cyber safety talks in schools, bike engraving and blue light discos.


The issue of the two current e scooter franchises was raised. There are safety concerns for pedestrians as the scooters travel on the footpaths and at a fast pace with no method of warning walkers as they do not and are not required to have warning devices. There are also concerns with the scooters not having a strong enough stand mechanism to hold them upright therefore they fall over and look untidy and cause safety issues. The Police Coordinator explained that there are By-laws governing the use of the scooters and she will send a copy for us to look at. The feedback provided at the meeting has been sent to the Transport Policy Team for their inclusion with other feedback and issues.

Helen Donovan also provided us with some information re the e-scooter trial.

The City of Adelaide has been working closely with the State Government, Minister for Transport and SAPOL on the e-scooter trial. DPTI and the Minister are waiting on the outcomes of the evaluation of the trials before determining any further changes to the e-scooter Regulations (including possible options like expanding the allowable area or permitting them in bike lanes).

The City of Adelaide has commenced the evaluation process and will be looking to present the findings of the two trials to Council prior to the end of the current permit (13 October 2019). The report will include user statistics, complaints and injury data along with trends and issues identified by the different stakeholders to develop a series of proposals for consideration.


VEHICLE SECURITY - THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE

There are a number of valuable items that are a common target for thieves to steal from vehicles because of their value and ability to be sold for quick cash. These include:

- Laptops
- GPS devices
- Mobile phones
- Cameras
- Sporting and fishing goods
- Cash/wallets

Reduce your chances of becoming a victim of theft, consider the following security tips.

- Ensure all valuables are removed from your vehicle or conceal them in the boot before arriving at your destination.
- Lock your vehicle doors & close windows.
- Install an audible alarm.
- At night park your vehicle in a welllit area.



- Park your vehicle in a garage at night where possible.
- Avoid hiding a second set of keys in the vehicle - if the vehicle is broken into, they may find the keys and take the car as well as yourvaluables.
- Avoid placing bags and wallets on the passenger seat where they could be easily grabbed.

Thieves will look into vehicles to see what items can be easily stolen. Even a small amount of cash may be the catalyst for becoming a target. Ensure you conceal or remove all cash and valuable items from your vehicle.

SECURE YOUR NUMBER PLATES

Approximately 3,000 number plates are stolen in South Australia each year. RAA is working with the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure, SA Police, the Attorney General's Department and the Motor Trade Association to encourage motorists to have tamper-resistant screws installed on their vehicle's number plates. A number of RAA Approved Repairers are offering to supply and install tamper-resistant screws <u>free of charge</u>.

Number plates are stolen from vehicles to commit crimes such as:

- petrol theft
- avoiding speeding fines and other traffic offences, or
- robberies and house break-ins.

The use of stolen number plates makes it harder for police to detect and investigate crimes in a timely manner.

To reduce your chances of becoming a victim of number plate theft, please consider the following security tips:

- Secure your number plates with **tamper-resistant screws**. The screws lock in place to prevent number plates from being removed easily.
- Check your vehicle regularly to ensure the number plates are secure.
- Secure your vehicle in a locked garage where possible.
- Park your vehicle in well-lit areas.

Remember:

- If your number plate is stolen, report it immediately to police by calling the Police Assistance line on 131 444.


HANDS OFF
