Review your Home Security before Easter

Are you going away this Easter? To reduce • Install and activate an alarm system. the opportunity for thieves to take advantage of your absence please consider the following security tips:

- Ensure appropriate keyed locks are fitted to all doors and windows.
- When you are outside the house, be sure to lock all doors and windows.
- Cracked or broken windows are inviting to thieves, especially if valuable items are in plain sight.
- Lock gates, garages and sheds when not in use and lock away all garden tools and ladders securely.
- Keep trees/bushes in front of doors and windows trimmed to avoid hiding places.

- Don't leave a house key under the door mat or pot plant, in the letterbox or in other obvious places.
- Don't leave/hide valuables in obvious places. Thieves target jewellery boxes and other valuables on bedroom dressers, in bedside drawers, in cupboards or under mattresses
- Keep a detailed inventory of valuables. These records will assist SA Police and your insurance company to recover or replace stolen items. Take detailed photographs of valuables
- Lock your meter box to prevent thieves interfering with your power supply.

COVID-19 UPDATE Sunday 15 March 2020

A public health emergency has been declared in South Australia because of deepening concerns about the spread of coronavirus.

The number of cases in the state has climbed to 20 — the latest being a woman aged in her 60s who recently returned from the US.

All of the state's cases have been people who had travelled overseas or interstate. or contracted the virus from a relative who had been overseas, SA Premier Steven Marshall said.

Mr Marshall today took part in the first meeting of the new national cabinet in response to coronavirus with other state leaders and the Prime Minister.

More than 600 people have been tested for COVID-19 at the five metropolitan testing sites since their opening. These sites include Royal Adelaide Hospital, Lyell McEwin Hospital, Flinders Medical Centre, Women's and Children's Hospital and SA Pathology's drive-through collection service at the Repat.

People who have travelled anywhere overseas must self-isolate for 14 days on return to Australia.

The SA Premier said public compliance with guidelines had so far been good, but steps could be taken where breaches occurred.

"Authorities in South Australia do have the ability to take further action if they think there are people who are ignoring the directives," Mr Marshall said.

"We've got the ability under the Public Health Act already in place to not only direct people, but enforce that using SAPOL (SA Police)."

BACKGROUND

COVID-19 can cause mild symptoms which may include fever, sore throat, cough or fatigue. For some people, it can be more severe and can lead to pneumonia or breathing difficulties and can even be fatal.

Importantly, people should call ahead if visiting their GP so the practice can prepare for their visit. Specialised COVID-19 clinics are only for people who have symptoms and have recently returned from overseas, or have had contact with a known COVID-19 case.

Travel bans are in place for certain countries, as of today this also includes Italy.

World Health Organisation (WHO) 'phishing' scam

SA Police are warning of a phishing email which claims to be from WHO and contains a 'button' to seek more information regarding safety measures to protect yourself from the Coronavirus.

Clicking on the button will take the user to a phishing website which appears to be a legitimate WHO page.

This page will prompt the user to enter personal details, including email address and password.

These personal details can then be used to steal the user's identity.

Phishing is an attempt to commit identity theft by disguising the attempt in a manner that appears to be from a trustworthy entity.

Think About It

Take the time to think before following links or clicking on buttons contained in emails.

Phishing emails often contain spelling and grammatical errors which would not be expected from the organisation from which the email was supposedly sent.



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- in a couple relationship such as marriage or dating

- · verbal abuse
- · property damage
- · financial abuse
- · threats to harm
- stalking.

Domestic violence is damaging to victims, their children, family & friends.

Where possible we try to hold the person responsible for the violence accountable for their actions.

SAPOL Bike Passport

SAPOL, the SA Government and NHW have joined forces to create and distribute a bike passport. The Bike Passport provides simple tips to reduce your chances of becoming a victim of bike theft. Consider the following crime prevention tips:

- Engrave or mark your bike frame (near the serial number)
 with an ultraviolet (UV) pen, microdot or by other permanent
 means with your driver's licence number prefixed by the letter
 '5' for South Australia. e.g. \$123456.
- Mark all accessories including helmet, lights, pump, saddle, etc.
- · Take a photograph of your bike.
- · Complete the Bike Passport and keep it in a safe place,
- · Purchase and fit a good quality bike lock.
- Always park and secure your bike in well-lit and populated areas.
- · Always lock the frame and both wheels to a secure object.
- When securing your bike, remove equipment including helmet, lights, pump, etc.
- Never leave your bike unattended and unlocked, even for a short period of time.
- When at home, secure your bike in a locked shed or inside your house.

Any information the public can give Police helps in their investigations.


