### **AUTUMN TERM 1**

### WONDERFUL WORLD Y2 & Y5



Students will have the opportunity to share what they love about the world, explore the story of Creation from a Christian perspective, play 'Creation Chronology' and take part in a quiz. Year 5 students will also create their own news report in the style of 'Newsround', to report on how the world is being damaged and what we can do, before creating a video game about how to save our planet.

#### **AUTUMN TERM 2**

#### **ANTI-BULLYING Y3**





Built around the annual national theme, this workshop engages students with topical videos, scenarios, news stories and relevant Bible content. Year 3 will have the opportunity to explore and discuss ideas around anti-bullying in an interactive and empowering way, helping to bring unity to school life.

#### **AUTUMN TERM 2**

#### **CHRISTMAS Y1 & Y4**

Y1 - This festive workshop takes students on a journey of the very first Christmas through the eyes of the donkey, who carried Mary to Bethlehem. Through a carousel of activities, Year 1 will explore the well-known, and the not so well-known, parts of the Nativity.

Y4 - Students will journey into the very first Christmas to discover parts of the story they never knew - was Jesus really born on the 25th December and how many wise men were there really? Year 4 will then go on the journey themselves, to see where they end up and who they meet along the way.

## SPRING TERM 1 STORYTELLING Y4



Our Storytelling Workshop is a cross-curricular workshop that builds students RE knowledge and literacy skills.

Year 4 will discover the power of a 'blurb', play 'Character Taboo' and explore the Biblical story of The Lost Son, learning that we are all loved and accepted no matter what. After completing a story quiz, in small groups using props, students will recreate a contemporary version of that story through the art of drama and storytelling.





#### **SUMMER TERM 2**

#### I'M A Y6, GET ME OUT OF HERE!



This workshop focuses on the transition from Year 6 to high school. It is packed full of activities to help students learn to not just survive, but thrive at secondary school. Year 6 will have the opportunity to reflect on their primary school experience, share their hopes and worries for secondary school, play games focusing on friendships and challenges, explore how to be resilient and think about their star qualities!

#### **SPRING TERM 2**

### EASTER Y2& Y5





Y2 - Take the opportunity to look beyond chocolate eggs and find out what Easter is really about. Why is someone dying on Good Friday 'good', and what has a curtain got to do with anything?! Year 2 will explore the story through puzzles, games and music.

Y5 - This Easter Workshop builds on students RE knowledge as they take on the challenge of the Easter Escape Room! Year 5 will need to crack codes, solve clues, piece together puzzles and search symbols to find out what really happened on that very first Easter. The question is, can they escape...?!
