Golf Course Tree Removal Process

The resident must place a work order at the front office, a copy of the work order may be printed for the resident.

The Golf course superintendent receives the work order reports weekly

The golf course superintendent will review the request and go out to evaluate and inspect the item in question.

The golf course superintendent will either approve the work order request or / deny/ close it with a note of why it is being denied, if work order request is denied the golf course superintendent will close out the work order with comments.

If approved the golf course superintendent will fill out the form and sign it. The resident will have to pick it up at the Golf Pro shop.

THE RESIDENT MUST BRING IN A COPY TO THE FRONT OFFICE FOR OUR RECORDS.

However, the cost associated with their removal will be your responsibility. Please be aware these tree(s)/ hedges/ palm trees could also be used as a buffer (depending on the locaion of your house on the golf course) to redirect errant golf balls. With the buffer removed, your house could be less protected from an errant golf shot. Kings Ridge Golf Club will not be responsible for any damages to your property due to errant golf balls.
Since a pine tree is not considered a hardwood, replating is not required. Therefore, Kings Ridge Golf Club will not be responsible for any future plantings when a pine tree(s) is/are removed from a buffer area.
You will need to schedule the removal withat the Pro Shop to make sure that it does not conflict with anything scheduled on the golf course.
Also, the tree service company that you hire, will need to coordinate how their equipment, as well as what kind of equipment can enter the golf course to minimize any potential damage.
Kings Ridge Golf Club will not be responsible for any damage which occurs to the golf course or surrounding structures during the removal of the tree(s). In case of any damage to the golf course or other personal property while removing the tree(s), it will be the responsibility of the homeowner/ contractor to make all necessart repairs.
