-  Free service — books are delivered right to your home.
-  Large selection of reading material.
-  No doctor's note required.
-  Easy returns — simply flip the card on the mailer and put it out for pickup.

How to Apply

Follow the steps below to apply for the Books by Mail program:

1. Get a Books by Mail application by [downloading this form](#) or emailing to servreq@mylakelibrary.org
2. Submit the completed application in one of these ways:
 - Submit digital form via email (contact servreq@mylakelibrary.org for digital application)
 - Send printed form in the mail to:

- Applications may also be dropped off at any Lake County library location. They will be forwarded to the Books by Mail office.

Once applications have been received and verified, you will be contacted with further information.

If you're not sure what you want to read and want to explore the online catalog, follow these instructions:

- Log into the website at <https://www.mylakelibrary.org/>
- Click on the **RED Patron Login**. This will bring you to the catalog where it will prompt you to log in again with your card number (**NO SPACES**) and your 4-digit **PIN**.

Once you are logged in, you will see your account dashboard.

Use the search bar and filters to find the item(s) you want.

When you find a book or item, click on the **item title** and this will open its description and availability.

If that's the item you want, click on **Place Hold**, be sure to **change the Pickup Location to BOOKS BY MAIL**, then click **Confirm Hold**. Your item will now show as **Pending**.

Congratulations! You can hold up to 30 items at a time.

Remember we have a library at the Clubhouse, too.
