The word Love can bring up many different kinds of feelings. We say we love pizza, our children and our spouse, but hopefully we don't love them in the same way. The word pizza may alert our taste buds that a good meal will be had. While loving our children brings very different emotions, such as care, protection, pride and joy. While loving our spouse, brings about emotions like comfort, pleasure, and romantic love which is really a mutual attraction that leads to a strong bond between two people that lasts a lifetime.

Love is a profound concept and central to the Christian faith. Love reveals the very nature of God. "God is love" (I John 4:8) suggests that love isn't simply an abstract idea, it's the essence of who god is. When we think about love do we consider love to be a feeling or an action?

Feelings of love can be powerful and deeply human. These emotions can draw us into relationships, ignite compassion, and create bonds of intimacy. When we think of love, our hearts and minds can move towards moments of joy and connection.

But Scripture warns us not to rely on our emotions alone, because feelings can be fleeting and can change depending on the circumstances. For instances, in marriage, feelings of love may ebb and flow, but that doesn't diminish the nature of the commitment. While emotions are a part of love, they are not what leads to a lasting loving relationship.

Scripture often portrays love as an action. Paul describes love as patient, kind, not envious or boastful, not self-seeking, and always persevering. (1 Corinthians 13:4-7) These traits are not emotions but rather actions that require choice and effort to live out in our daily lives.

Jesus demonstrated how love is an action through His acts of love, when he healed the sick, fed the hungry, forgave sins, and laid down His life, so we could be reconciled with god, Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this; to lay down one's life for one's friend." (John 15:13) His sacrifice on the cross was the ultimate expression of love, and it wasn't based on a feeling but on obedience to the Father.

Jesus demonstrated how love is an action through His acts of love, when he healed the sick, fed the hungry, forgave sins, and laid down His life, so we could be reconciled with god, Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this; to lay down one's life for one's friend." (John 15:13) His sacrifice on the cross was the ultimate expression of love, and it wasn't based on a feeling but on obedience to the Father.

Acts of love can stir feelings of joy and peace, both in the giver and the receiver. While the feelings of can inspire s to do good.

Jesus taught that the greatest commandment is to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself." This kind selfless love does not come naturally for most, but as Christians we need to aspire to live this commandment out in our lives.

Love doesn't have to be grand or dramatic, because it's in the small, consistent actions, like listening patiently, offering encouragement, and helping others that love can become transformational and enduring.

So love is both a feeling and an action, but as Christians, it's the action that demonstrates the depth and authenticity of Christ's love and draws us closer to Go and each other. When we choose to love, even when we don't feel like it, we embody the sacrificial love that Jesus demonstrated.




