# PASTOR'S NOTE

# Behold!

And the angel said unto them, Fear not: for, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord.

As I write this, it seems almost impossible to think that the time change, Thanksgiving, and the Advent season are standing on our doorstep, demanding attention. The time change is a blessing and a curse—an extra hour of sleep. It is nice to think that instead of staying in bed until 8 o'clock, it is only 7 o'clock, and we snuggle down into the covers a little more deeply. The downside is the nights get longer earlier, and there is the possibility that we may experience depression.
