



"Jesus Makes the Difference" by James A. Harnish

What does it mean to live the Christian Life, to respond to the invitation of Jesus who said, "Come to me – take my yoke"? A response by Mother Teresa: "Put yourself completely under the influence of Jesus, so that he may think his thoughts in your mind, do his work through your hands, for you will be all – powerful with him to strengthen you."

DISCIPLE III: REMEMBER WHO YOU ARE.

The driving idea in this Bible study is the connection between our memory and identity as the people of God. Participants in this thirty – two week study will read the major and minor Old Testament prophets, with the exception of Daniel, and will read the thirteen Letters traditionally attributed to Paul. To establish the historical context in which the prophets spoke for God, daily reading assignments draw also on the books of Deuteronomy through Chronicles. Several themes weave their way through the study – the call to remember; the call to repentance; the need for renewed vision; and the place of community. The prophets and Paul are continually calling hearers and readers back to their God and to a sense of who they are as a people "set apart." Time commitment: 32 week study with holiday breaks, 3 to 4 hours independent study each week, to start **September 4 at 7 p.m**. About seven from New Market and Mt. Carmel have expressed interest. While having taken Disciple I and II are helpful, it is not a requirement. The study will meet every Wednesday in the Education Building kitchen; contact Nick Wood if interested: 301-865-5378.
