# NEW MARKET UMC NEWSLETTER FOR DECEMBER 2010

Have you ever woken up angry? When you wake up is the first cohesive thought an angry one? Have you ever woken up worried? Have you ever woken up scared? Do you ever go through your days vaguely unsatisfied, worried about your future, angry because of something you don't have?

If so, here's another question. Why? We are the children of a loving and caring God fills our lives every day with good gifts and the things we need every day. We are still breathing, we have people who love and care for us, we have freedom unheard of in many other parts of the world. We have uncountable blessings. What reason do we have to worry, or be angry?

Have you noticed, over the last several years, everyone being on edge? A lot of it has to do with the economy and the worry that somehow we will be left on the wanting side. I think another part of it is constantly demanding of more and feeling we are receiving less. We have come to expect instant gratification and when gratification is delayed we get on edge irritated, worried. And this is not how God intends us to live.

Both of these attitudes have everything to do with being convinced, overwhelmed with the idea that we are entitled – the belief that we are entitled to everything the world has to offer. We covet nice houses, nice cars, good food, impeccable service, perfect marriages, the latest TV, or cell phone, or computer, everything, and when we don't get it we get worried, or angry, and demanding. But we have forgotten one thing, we don't deserve, are not entitled to any of that stuff. We are not even entitled to the next breath we will take! They are in fact all gifts of God, not entitlements, but gifts.

In fact by putting the things we think we are entitled to at the center of our concern, we have forgotten about God. Keeping this in mind, hear once again Paul's words in Romans. "For although they knew God, they neither glorified him as God nor gave thanks to him. But their thinking became futile and their foolish hearts were darkened. Although they claimed to be wise they became fools and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images made to look like mortal man and birds and animals and reptiles". .. he continues in vs. 28, "Furthermore, since they did not think it worthwhile to retain the knowledge of God, he gave them over to a depraved mind, to do what ought not to be done. They have become filled with every kind of wickedness, evil, greed, and depravity. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit and malice. They are gossips, slanderers, God haters, insolent, arrogant and boastful, they invent ways of doing evil." Talk about being in the wrong frame of mind!

What Paul is saying that we have lost the healthy perspective of having God at the center of our lives and recognizing God as the source of all things. Instead of

acknowledging God, we simply take what we can get and call ourselves entitled.

In the Gospel, we read about the 10 lepers healed by Jesus. Nine of those lepers went to the pool to wash, and then being healed went their merry way, happy with their stroke of fortune, as though they had somehow been entitled to this wondrous gift. One former leper, on the other hand recognized the healing for what it was, an unmerited gift. And he returned to Jesus to give thanks.

I remember one morning I was down in Baltimore for a meeting. I had a little time to kill so I dropped into a Starbucks coffee shop for some coffee. In front of me was this lady who apparently had her heart set on a Caramel Machiato Venti. Unfortunately they were having an equipment problem and it would be a while before she could have her Caramel Machiato Venti. To say that she was put out would be an understatement. She obviously felt she deserved that Caramel Machioto Venti. She could not survive without it. She demanded it! She was entitled to it! Not one "please", just demands. "It's my coffee and I want it now!" She was giving the poor barista a real hard time and making everyone else miserable.

When we convince ourselves, or let others convince us that we are deserving, that we are entitled, to the things we have or desire to possess, we will always ultimately be disappointed. Angry because we don't have what we think we deserve and worried that we won't get what we want or need. We will gripe because we don't get the Caramel Machiato Venti that we think we deserve, and make ourselves and everyone else miserable to boot.

We need to celebrate thanksgiving, if for no other reason, than to change our perspective. When we give thanks to God we are recognizing that God is the source of all gifts and that we are entitled no nothing. When we give thanks to God we put the world into proper perspective and discover that we are happy and grateful for a glass that's half full of blessings, rather than angry about a glass that's half empty. In thanksgiving we count our blessings rather than the absence of things we really don't deserve anyway.

Please and thank you, remember those words? Nothing more than simple manners, these words are getting scarcer and scarcer. When I was a kid I was reminded constantly to say please and thank you, and I was scolded when I didn't. They are words that recognize, that acknowledge the giver as important and appreciated. They convey, not demand, but humble request. They recognize that what we receive is a gift, not an entitlement.

Don't wake up angry about what you haven't got. You probably don't need it anyway. Your really aren't entitled to it, and living with that attitude will make you miserable. Instead wake up thanking God for the things he has given you. For some of us, it may not be much, but it is treasure beyond measure because it was given you by the hand of a loving God.
