God With Us

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them a light has shone. You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy...For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Each year, as the Christmas drama unfolds we hear the cries of the prophets, "behold a virgin shall deliver a son," "unto us a child is born," "a shoot shall spring forth from the stump of Jesse," "from you Bethlehem a Savior shall come." These phrases connect the infant in the manger to promises made centuries before his birth. The word of the prophets challenge us to consider Jesus as the pinnacle of God's eternal plan.

Join us each week in December and on Christmas Eve as we discover the power of the promises delivered in the Christ child and embrace the promise of God's increasing presence.

May Jesus be for you this Christmas a Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, and Prince of Peace!

#### This & That!

Christmas Music - I love everything about Christmas but especially the music. Usually I'll start listening and singing early on. One of my favorites is "God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen." I went on line and found out that, like so many early Christmas songs, this carol was written as a direct reaction to the music of the 15th Century Church. Music of the organized religion were usually written in Latin and their melodies were somber and dark. Because of this, the peasant class led a quiet rebellion against the tone of religious music by writing religious folk songs that were light, lively and penned in common language. The lyrics reveal that the song's unknown writer knew the story of Jesus' birth well and understood the power of Christ and what His arrival meant to all who embraced it.

God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen was the most famous and loved of all the early carols and its upbeat melody and message of the birth of Jesus in joyful terms, I think, is why it is still loved today. Next time you sing it pay attention to the words - you'll see the Christmas story in a nutshell. If your Christmases past and/or present have some sadness, just think what it would be like if Christ had never been born and I think you'll feel JOY!
