Carmel UMC prepare 63 packs of food for students at Spring Ridge Elementary and Oakdale Middle School, while New Market UMC prepares 21 packs of food for students at New Market Elementary, New Market Middle, Deer Crossing Elementary, and

Oakdale Elementary. That is 84 students in our local community that are being blessed by our Hope 4 Kids program!

Behind the scenes, more than 50 volunteers help each month to manage inventory, fundraise, order food, shop for additional items, deliver items to the schools, and, of course, prepare the packs. ## **Update on the Coffee Truck**

In November Patty and Pastor Scott attended a Ministry Hatchery seminar in Linthicum, MD. Their goal was to see if the ministry idea of operating a Coffee Truck that offered coffee and pie to the community wherever the community was gathering. The truck would be available at NMUMC events, community events, community practice fields in the evenings, etc. wherever large groups of people where gathering. The plan was to engage with the community with radical hospitality, kindness, and a trained listening ear that would ask the next pertinent questions to form deeper relationships.



The idea was well received and affirmed by both the leadership, the "shark tank" judges, and the other participants. The proposed name was also received with great passion. "A Cup of J.O.E." (Jesus over everything). A side ministry connected to the project would be a pie making gathering that would be sold at the truck. This ministry would be for participants of all ages who would come together and bake pies at either the Grange or Mt Carmel (commercial kitchens). We came back invigorated and empowered and with some seed money \$700.00 by winning the proof of conception award. Our team, (Kate Hanson, Jodie Phillips, Patty Robinson and Pastor Scott) was encouraged by the Hatchery leadership to do several one offs (single events) this coming year. Our kick-off date is the Easter Egg Roll on Saturday April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2020. The team is currently working on coffee roaster selection, branding the name and domain name, researching borrowing the Lions concession trailer for the one off. Please keep this ministry in your prayers, if you would like to contribute to this new ministry- mark the memo line in your check Coffee Truck, if you are interested in joining the team or interesting in volunteering to serve on the truck or to make pies, please let Pastor Scott know.

#### An update on the financial health of the church from the Finance Committee

Because both giving and attendance were down in October, we are slipping behind in meeting the budgeted goal for giving this year. However, we are ahead of last year's giving for the January-October period thanks to your overall strong giving. *Thank you*!

Below you can compare giving in 2018 through October 31, 2019, as well as year-end goals.

The mortgage debt has been reduced by \$36,720.77 during the last twelve months thanks to the many designated mortgage reduction gifts from you, as well as our applying the full rent payment from the parsonage. In past years some of that rent money was used to close gaps in our budget. Last year the Finance Team challenged the congregation to give enough to fully support our church budget so that we could use the difference between the required monthly payment on the loan and the rent we receive for the parsonage to make principal only payments. Thank you for taking up that challenge and besting it by giving additional funds to pay down the loan.

As of November 7, 2019, the mortgage debt has been reduced to \$72,860.55. The original balance on this five year loan was \$177,871.02 in January 2016. This means that of the \$105,010.47 in principal that has been paid over the last almost four years, \$85,139.45 of it (almost 81%) was paid down in the last two years! The loan is due to be refinanced in February, 2021. If we want to eliminate that step and be debt free, a very strong commitment of giving from our church family will be needed. Once the goal of being debt free is reached we will be able to focus more on ministering to our congregation, community and missions.

We are so "very thankful" for the tithing of our committed and steadfast congregation. The Finance Committee would like to wish you all a blessed Christmas.


