#### Loan Payoff

As directed by the Council at their October 22 meeting, the church parsonage/schoolhouse loan was paid off on November 1. The pay-off amount of \$32,603.24 was made with funds in the checking account. The Council further directed that all funds from parsonage rent, as well as the Thanksgiving offering, go toward replenishing the cash flow in the checking account.
