# We are getting a Deacon! Welcome Rev. Laura Isaac as Youth Pastor

For the first time in our 165-year history the Lord is blessing us with a deacon. Rev. Laura Isaac has been hired to serve as our youth pastor. Pastor Laura has a Master of Divinity Degree from Duke Seminary and is ordained as a deacon by the North Carolina Conference of the UMC. Like Elders (Pastors like Pastor Jenny) deacons are called and ordained to a lifetime of service. Deacons are ordained to a ministry of word, service, compassion and justice.

Like elders they are trained and invited to preach and teach and provide pastoral care. They do not preside over baptism and communion. Deacons focus on ministry that brings the church into the world — and the world into the church. Unlike Elders and Local Pastors, Deacons are not appointed by the Bishop, rather they are invited to find their own ministry settings. Laura is thus hired by our Leadership Equipping Team to serve the youth of our community.

Rev. Laura will care for each youth in their uniqueness, support families, and help our young people find meaningful missions through which they can use their gifts to serve God's people. As Lindsey Brown said after her interview, "Pastor Laura will be awesome because she is focused on the stuff that we are going through and understands our interests." Pastor Laura will serve 20-hours per week.

#### \*2020 Capital spending requirement:

\$18,831.00 is needed this year to repair the educational building roof. The roof inspection reports the roof has reached its end of life and must be replaced this year. The education building is a hub for nursery, preschool, VBS, meetings, religious study, library and community outreach. The Trustees and Pastor Scott wish to schedule the repair in early spring after preschool finishes and before the spring rains begin. A special Thanksgiving offering was communicated to the congregation in November and \$9,025 has already been donated. \$9,000 to go. #### **Mortgage Debt**

One of the church goals this year is to become debt free, quite a challenge. When the mortgage on the parsonage and schoolhouse was refinanced in 2016, the mortgage totaled \$177,871.02. As of January 25, 2020, the debt balance is \$57,755.07. We are very close to the refinancing deadline of February 2021 and it would be wonderful to be debt free. ### **LOCAL PASTOR PATH**


