This past Sunday, January 8th, 2023, there were 38 children in Sunday School, 48 worshipers at the 9:30 service and 70 at the 11:00 service. All our outreach events (egg roll, Trek and Treat) grow larger each year. The UMW, LIFT, and choir, are in different stages of a growth spurt. God is good and as we continue to be faithful with our gifts, presence, prayer, and service, I believe we will continue in this pattern.



For those of you who know or even heard of Roger VanLaan and were unable to attend his birthday party, below is the beautiful speech he gave on December 10, 2022 –

#### HIS 100TH BIRTHDAY

Well. This is quite a night. It is humbling to have so many of you here tonight to help celebrate this milestone with me. First, to everyone who helped put this together, but especially Jim and Ginny, thank you. I said, at my 90th, that people should mark their calendars for tonight, and I think it really did take ten years of work to put this together. There's been a constant stream of chores and assignments, phone calls and emails, over the last several months, and I'm sure that more of you than I even know have been recruited to help with one task or another. Thank you all.

Finally, I want to thank each of you for making the trip. Whether you traveled across the pond, across the country, or across the street, your being here tonight is a gift that means more than I can say.

We've all heard that it takes a village to raise a child; well by the time you reach one hundred, it takes a small city.

I wouldn't be here tonight without the help and support of this group of people, whether it's family, neighbors, the church community, or the ever-expanding circle of friends that ebb and flow around us all. So much of our lives are defined by the people with whom we choose to spend our time, and I have been luckier than most in those choices.

It's impossible to reflect on 100 years without talking about the changes marked by that stretch of time. As much has changed, the important things have largely stayed the same. Whether people are driving horses or driving tractors, we still have farmers working every day to feed their communities, even if those communities are bigger and more global than ever before. Whether the technology of the day is telegraph of space travel, we're still trying to make connections and build community. Whether we're sending letters or snapchats, our messages are similar - what did you do, how was your day, did you see this, I miss you.

It's easy to focus on the negativity lately, the way the country and world seem to be at odds with itself, and even families are fractured with rifts and strife. However, the message I want to give you all is that there is more constant than change, more good than bad, and that we can choose which we effect. Our

values define us and our communities. At 100, I offer you that Faith and Family, Imagination and kindness would be a better use of our energy and offer us better returns for the future than the constant state of bitterness and disrespect that we seem to have found ourselves in lately. The times and trappings may change, but these values allow us to navigate a steady course despite the changing landscape.

The Sinclair family likes to sing their awful "birthday dirge" instead of the traditional version, and I know many of you have suffered through the "tears and sorrow fill the air, people dying everywhere" lyrics. At 100, that feels more true than I'd like to admit, so nights like this where we can celebrate happy events become more and more important. Let's focus on the celebrations and the successes, on the values that we want to be constants through the ages.

If we are defined by the people, we spend time with, it is my privilege to be here with all of you. Tonight, I can sincerely say it's a HAPPY BIRTHDAY, but I can also say it's been a mostly happy century, and I wish that same happiness and fulfillment for each of you.

#### Donations to Fossett Property/Building Fund in 2022

Your generous giving made the purchase of this property a reality. Thank you to the 39 families/individuals who have donated to the Fossett Property and/or the Building Fund. Of that, 24 were one-time donations, 6 twice, 1 three times, 2 4 times, 1 6 times, 1 8 times, 2 11 times, 1 12 times, and 1 13 times.

At the end of 2022, the \$75,000 pledged by the Finance Team toward the cost of the property will be transferred from the checking account to the Fossett Property account. *All future donations toward a building project will be credited to the Building Fund.* In addition, all expenses associated with the property will be charged to the account for the expense (water/sewer, lawn maintenance, etc.) That was not done in 2022 to allow us to see at a glance the additional costs of ownership.

#### FY23 Budget

At their November meeting, the Church Council approved a budget of \$243,682.48 -- an 11.2% increase. The weekly offering needed to fund that amount will increase to \$4686.21. Based on giving to the regular offering in 2022, it is anticipated that is an attainable amount. With your continued support, the programs at NMUMC will thrive.

Giving Statements for 2022 will be sent out by the end of this month (January). Those not having email will receive their statement in the mail; all others will be emailed. Please contact the finance chair (cgzimm@comcast.net) regarding any questions on your statement.


