Invitation To the Observance of Lenten Discipline

Every year when Ash Wednesday rolls around we may start thinking, "What am I going to give up for Lent this year"? Chocolates, desserts, alcohol, going to work? We may even try to get creative, "I think I will give up couscous", yeah, that will be easy or the classic, "I will give up giving things up for Lent". If we

fail at our giving up of certain things, then we feel miserable about ourselves as we shove that last piece of chocolate cake into our mouths. Some pastors will go easy on us and remind us during the 40 days of Lent, Sundays are not counted, little Easters, we call them, little loopholes I call them.

Early Christians observed Lent with great devotion, they prepared themselves to follow the Lord's footsteps to the passion and the resurrection. Lent after all is 40 days of spiritual preparation. How does one spiritually prepare by giving something up? Giving up a meal during the week can remind you of others who do not have food security. Giving up a luxury can remind you that others do not have the same means to luxury items. Giving up a bad habit may lead to positive changes in your life that can go far beyond Lent. I, however, would like to encourage others to take something up for Lent instead of denial. You can form a new spiritual discipline.

We have provided a daily **Lenten calendar** that can lead you toward spiritual preparedness as we approach Holy Week. There are challenges connected with each day that can help you move into the offered scripture for that day. There are also the St. Andrews Society daily devotions "The Cup of Salvation" that will be available in the rear of the sanctuary. If you do not currently partake of daily devotions this gives you a couple of opportunities to start this life changing habit. If devotions are already a part of your daily



The approved budget for 2021 totaled \$215,346.90. As has been noted before, the regular offering is what supports the yearly approved budget. You will see in the above chart that donations to the regular offering totaled \$234,333.94 (deposits + online giving). We are blessed to have a giving, caring congregation, who not only supported the local church program, but donated a significant amount to local missions, as well as to several individuals needing assistance.

Your faithful giving, no longer paying a monthly mortgage payment, and banking the \$2100 monthly parsonage rent, has greatly improved the financial situation of NMUMC. Please continue to prayerfully consider the direction God is leading this church.

Update

The Council voted on Wednesday evening (2/23) to proceed with making an offer on the Fossett property. If this acquisition is supported by the congregational vote on Sunday, February 27, the process of building a New Worship Center will be started, but there are many steps (and years) before that would become a reality.

As of 2/23, the cost and funding of the project is: \$180,500 asking price, \$5,500 in closing costs = \$186,000 The Finance Team has voted to provide \$75,000 from the General Fund; the generosity of 22 individuals/families have pledged \$106,000 = \$181,000 (\$5,000 more is needed to fully fund the asking price and closing costs).

The Leadership Team would like to raise \$200,000 to fund the purchase, closing costs and reclamation of the property, as well as any unanticipated costs. All donations, small or large, will help to provide the needed funding. You can mark your offering to the building fund.

As stated above, please continue to prayerfully consider the direction God is leading this church – and you.

Fossett Property Update

2/20/2022:

A) Straw poll and pledge cards received via email and bulletin.

B) Overwhelming favor for Phase 1 (purchase the Fossett property)

2/23/2022:


