A little boy holds in his hand the shriveled empty chrysalis. His cheeks are wet from tears as he laments over the vacant shell. "It's gone, it's over, and there is nothing left!" He had watched as his rescued caterpillar fashion that cocoon around its plumb body. He had watched how the shell kept it safe and sound in the cup. But when he awoke today the shell was EMPTY!

This month our sacred calendar contains the holiest of days through which we, like caterpillars, are re-made into Holy followers of Christ. The forty days of Lent are in many ways a cocoon wherein we are fashioned by God's holy story and the means of grace. In these days, we experience the forgiveness of sin as we confess and hear the savior say, "Father, forgive them". Our sinful lives are washed clean as we remember our baptism and sip on the cup of salvation. Our broken bodies and spirits are revived by the healing oil. Each day "THE WAY" of lent strengthens us as we feast on the words of Scripture and the presence of G od through prayer. In so many ways we are being transformed.

But there is a day coming, which no amount of preparation can fully prepare us to grasp. The facts of the story defy nature and gravity, the implications of the story defeat death and defy the grave. At the climax of this holy season is the audacious news that the tomb is EMPTY! That's right; the body of our savior is not wrapped tight and hid away. The grave is EMPTY and Jesus is not there to be found.

This revelation baffled his friends and followers. Though they had heard the promise of a resurrection they struggled to understand the vacant grave. Where is HE? How do we follow his footsteps if we can't see his feet? Jesus would appear to them over 40 days showing his nail holed hands and braking bread on the beach. Still there was a sense of mystery; the next step of the journey would not be a step, it would be a leap.




I can only imagine the grieving of those parents in Newtown and my prayer is that our Lord will encase them with His love that they will not fall so deep in grief that they can't move on.



Important Notice for Ushers and Close Out Helpers:
