40 Days

"40 days to leave your lovers", that is what Lent is all about, it is not about eating fish on Fridays, although that helps us to remember that we are observing a Lenten period. It is helpful to abstain from chocolate, soda, snacks, tobacco, alcohol, pills, or gossip because in excess these things are harmful to our bodies, unhealthy to our lives and probably unhealthy for the people that we love . We give these things up because



they are affections, and if we are not careful our affections can be our lovers. These lovers tend to get in the way of the one we are to truly love. By the grace and mystery of our baptism, these 40 days we remember that we are betrothed to only one. On Ash Wednesday and throughout Lent we do not bring to the altar our unsightly and debilitating habits, this season we bring to the altar ourselves, body and soul, and confess that we have not been very faithful lovers. And we come collectively to the altar as the church and confess, that as a body we also have not been very faithful lovers. But the fact of the matter is that most of us will flunk Lent. I have flunked Lent or as many years that I have been alive. That is not true, I grew up Presbyterian, so I did not even know what Ash Wednesday was, I thought it was just what Catholics did, until I became a Methodist.

So, in these 40 days, what would you like to fast from that competes for your undivided attention to God, family, and neighbor? In my own life I find myself buried in my phone during downtimes, rest times, waiting in the grocery store, etc. This Lent I am committed to fast from Facebook. I think what I see there impacts me negatively. Can I do it for 40 days? I am not sure, like I said I have flunked Lent so many times, but I would like to see if my perspective on the greater world changes. How about you? What are your unhealthy lovers? I think one of the top receivers of our affection is technology.

I am asking everyone to contemplate setting aside some time each week to be present with their family, friends, co-workers, fully present, to turn the technology off, and contemplate how much time technology might be stealing from our life. It may be for your family on Sunday afternoons to commit to no screens for a few hours and play a board game, you can break your fast with a movie that everyone loves. I know this will be a battle, but I believe it is worth fighting. I know the battle against technology may be futile but I think we all need to reset, repent, and be aware how much we are not present with those right beside us. I encourage you to find your place too fast. Whether that is from junk food, soda, or habits in your life that are stealing your presence in the now. I am aware that this will be a difficult journey for all of us, but the journey to the cross was made one step at a time in mindful obedience of our savior, where God made us fully aware of God's glory, God's grace, and God's forgiveness.

The name badges help Pastor Scott and the those assisting with Communion to easily call you by name when sharing the Lord's Supper.



This will be the last open meeting on the discernment, planning, and implementation, of the feasibility of expansion of ministry and buildings at NMUMC. New Market Town Cemetery Update

The process for taking ownership and maintenance of the New Market Town Cemetery has progressed quite a bit over the last month or so. The lot holder meeting was held on January 15th and they voted to accept all the new Articles of Incorporation and new bylaws. The "Agreement Concerning Transfer and Perpetual Operation and Care of New Market Cemetery" was finalized by the cemetery trustees and handed over to the church in late January. The church trustees and council have both reviewed the documents. A local attorney is finalizing the church version of the transfer papers. Once the revised document is completed and given to the cemetery trustees to approve, there will be another lot holder vote to approve the transfer. Although, this is a time consuming process, everyone concerned wants the transfer to take place in a proper fashion, and that takes diligent oversight. If you would like more information or have questions, contact the church office and they will put you in contact with one of the cemetery trustees.


