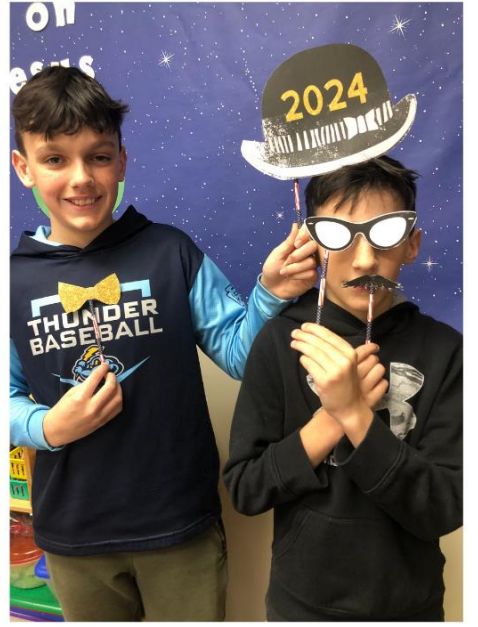
"40 days to leave your lovers"

That is what Lent is all about. It is not about eating fish on Fridays, although that helps us to remember that we are observing a Lenten period. It is helpful to abstain from chocolate, soda, snacks, tobacco, alcohol, pills or gossip, because in excess, these things are harmful to our bodies, unhealthy to our lives and probably unhealthy for the people we love. We give these things up because they are affections, and if we are not careful, our affections can become our lovers. These lovers tend to get in the way of the one we are to truly love. By the grace and mystery of our baptism, these 40 days we need to remember that we are betrothed to only one. On Ash Wednesday and throughout Lent, we do not bring to the altar our unsightly and debilitating habits; this season we bring to the altar ourselves, body and soul, and confess that as a body we also have not been very faithful lovers. We come collectively to the altar as the church and confess that, as a body, we also have not been very faithful lovers.

The fact of the matter is, most of us will flunk Lent. I have flunked Lent in as many years as I have lived. That is not true, I grew up as a Presbyterian, so I did not know what the significance of Ash Wednesday was. I thought it was what Catholics did, until I became a Methodist. So, in these 40 days, what would you like to fast from that competes for your undivided attention to God, family and neighbor? I find myself buried in my phone during downtimes, rest times, while waiting in line at the grocery store, etc. This Lent, I am committed to fasting from Facebook. What I see there impacts me negatively. Can I do it for 40 days? Not sure, but I would like to see if my perspective on the greater world changes. I believe one of the top receivers of our affection is technology. I am asking everyone to contemplate setting aside some time each week to be present with his/her family, friends, co-workers. Be fully present, to turn off the technology and contemplate how much time it might be stealing from our lives. It may be that on Sunday afternoons we commit to no screens for a few hours and play a board game or break your fast with a movie that everyone loves. This will be a battle, but it is worth fighting. The battle against technology may be futile, but we all need to reset, repent and be aware that this will be a difficult journey for all of us. The journey to the cross was made on step at a time in mindful obedience of our Savior, where God made us fully aware of His glory.

WE NEED CANDY, CANDY AND MORE CANDY- AND VOLUNTEERS

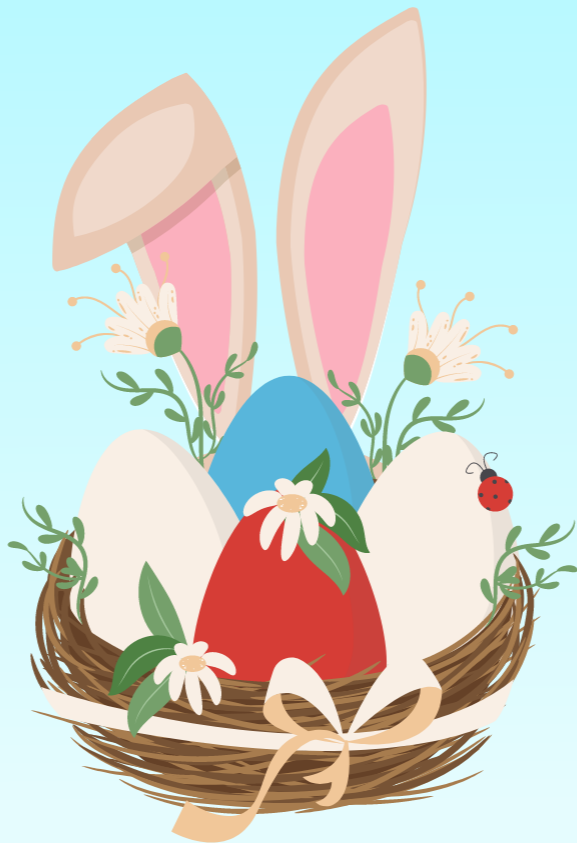

Budget Background/Information:

- 2022 marked the first time in many years that a balanced budget was presented and accepted by the Church Council. Prior to that time, cash flow was an issue but, thanks to your generous giving, that is no longer the case.
- In just three years, the income projection has increased from \$217,549.98 (2022) to \$316,500 (2024) and the expense projection has increased from \$217,549.98 (2022) to \$263,155.
- In 2024, funds received from the parsonage rent is no longer included as income for the operating budget.
- In January 2023, there was a total of \$333,800.89 in cash assets. Starting 2024, that figure has risen to \$415,956.91
