Our church building does not have a steeple. It was built in the style of a meeting house and meeting houses traditionally didn't have steeples. So I suppose sticking a steeple up there on the roof would violate some architectural rules. Meeting houses don't have steeples! Besides, the structure of our roof probably wouldn't support one.

But I miss having a steeple. I miss the soaring finger pointing to heaven and God as if to say, "that's where we are heading" or "heaven is the direction we take". The steeple can be a visible reminder to folks about where our focus should be – on God!

It's also kind of nice having something on the building indicating that we are a church. We have had people come to worship and literally ask someone in the parking lot which building is the church. (The Verizon switching office does in some ways resemble a modern church building). Sometimes I think it would be nice to have a soaring steeple on the roof declaring to the community that we are a church, we meet in this building, and our focus is on God's Kingdom.

Wait a minute; let's think about that a bit. Do we really need a steeple to say all these things? In fact, wouldn't it be more effective if our entire membership said the same thing to the people of our community in thought, word, and deed? Steeples may draw a few people to the church on Sunday morning but I think it would be way more effective if our members drew, and invited others to worship with us.

Do we need a steeple to tell our community where our focus as the church is? Wouldn't it speak much more loudly if all our members declared this in our conversations, interactions, and our faith lived out in the community? When Jesus commanded in Matthew 5:14 to "let your light shine before men" that he was talking about erecting a steeple on the roof and illuminating it with flood lights. He was telling us to be living steeples inviting and drawing people to God and the church in the way we live with and speak to others.

A steeple on the church would be nice if for no other reason than to indicate that there's a church back here. But I don't really think we need it. We need to point to heaven with our lives. We need to tell others who we are and what we believe. Remember it's not steeples that invite people to worship, its people like you and me.

What has helped me to grapple with the question of what comes after this life is getting back to basics with attending church, Sunday school and Bible study. Therefore, when I cannot attend I feel like I am missing something that will in the long run, make me more comfortable with some of the tough questions life throws at me.

I did not realize how truly blessed I am with being physically able to participate in all that our church has to offer until this last month when I was incapacitated with my illness. For me personally, all the activities are not only fun and pleasant to attend, but also educational and simply self satisfying.

So what is my point? I see several of you during the week and even more during the Sunday church services. However, I think that some of you are missing out on learning really good lessons by not taking advantage of all opportunities offered by our church and you do not have an incapacity to blame it on. Why not come to Bible study on Wednesday at 7:00 pm? Will taking that hour and spending it at home in front of the TV really be more satisfying to you? Will getting up and coming to adult Sunday school really put that much of a crimp in your Sunday mornings? Or how about volunteering an hour or so during Vacation Bible School, coming up in June? I know we are all busy, but a couple of hours a week here or there should not impact your world too much. I work full time, am the church Lay Leader, participate in two church committees, choir, Bible study, mentoring a confirmand, VBS planning, attend Sunday school, plan the annual church picnic

know what --- I wish I could do more.

We want our church to grow and get better and that can only begin from within, so come, participate and bring a friend!

Maybe you will be surprised how much you get in return.

During all my trials and tribulations over the last month with being sick, I thought it rather ironic, when I attended church on Sunday and on front of the bulletin were these words...

Fear thou not; for I am with thee...for I am thy God.
