## **Stuck at Home**



I think it is beneficial to view our current circumstances in the light of the scripture story of Noah and his family. There are many similarities between our current stay at home directive and the story of Noah and his family. Noah was instructed by God that in order to preserve his family and escape calamity that he not only needed to build this safe haven but had to stay in it for some time. This took a lot of preparation, (how much toilet paper would they really need) how much food needed to be secured

so that not only them but the animals in their care could survive the ordeal?

There are varying perspectives on just how long Noah and his family were "quarantined" in their new home. The Bible tells us that it rained for 40 days and 40 nights. The story recounts how even the highest mountains were covered with water and that the waters flooded the earth for 150 days. If you think you have a bad case of "cabin fever" in this time, just think how badly this fever had to be for Noah and his family. They could not go out and take a walk, make a quick trip to the grocery store, or binge-watch Netflix. There are many "educated guesses on how long they were sequestered in their new houseboat, some say 5 months others a year before the land was dry enough and vegetation began sprouting enough to nourish the inhabitants waiting patiently or impatiently on the gopher wood contraption. I think it is safe to say that they were "trapped" at home for a very long time.

Here is the beautiful thing, I want all of us to take hope in, the first verse of Genesis 8. It tells us that God remembered not only Noah but all the wild animals and livestock, God remembered all of the new creation. Is this to say that we worship a forgetful God? Did God forget that he had placed Noah and his family on the ark, the way we forget that we are boiling water for spaghetti while we watch The Tiger King? The Biblical meaning of remember in the Bible is that God is present and active in a given circumstance. God remembered (was present and active) Rachel and Hannah and opened their wombs (Genesis 30:22 and 1 Samuel 1: 19). God remembered (was present and active) His Holy word and covenant to Abraham (Psalm 105: 42). Jesus said to do this in remembrance (Jesus is present and active) in our communion meal. God is remembering us also in this time of crisis, God is present and active in rescuing us, refining us, saving us, and redeeming us. Trust in this, God is faithful, God does not leave us or forsake us, God is present and active with us. The wind (spirit) of God will come and dry up this virus in due course, we just need to remain faithful and patient. God is at work in all of God's creation to heal and make whole.









