

They saw that only the back roots came out of the ground so they wanted to save it. As United Methodists we value our connection with other congregations. Over the past few years New Market and Mt. Carmel UMC have seen first-hand the benefits of being in community with our neighborhood churches. Three years after the joining of our congregations again we are celebrating a strong New Market UMC and a grateful Mt. Carmel UMC. This week our Bishop, Marcus Matthews appointed our pastor team to Fairview Chapel. Fairview is a tiny historic chapel located in Lake Linganore which hosts a faithful group of worshipers at 7pm each Sunday night. Fairview is a limited service church which means that the pastors provide guidance and pastoral care to the worshipers but the preaching, worship, and administrative responsibilities of the church are coordinated by the Trustees of the chapel. Each week Fairview welcomes a pastor from the Frederick area to share the message. Pastor Jenny and Pastor Scott have been ask to provide pastoral guidance to Fairview chapel. This is an opportunity for our congregations to share the blessing of pastoral leadership. The church councils of the congregations will decide the relationship between the three churches. Fairview will provide a small financial payment to both congregations to acknowledge the sharing of pastoral time. There may be opportunities for worshipers of Fairview to share in Discipleship or mission activities with our parish.
