Pastor's Page

ADVENT IS NOT CHRISTMAS

Every year it happens. Why are we so surprised? Once we realize it is happening our chest starts to tighten, we fear we are way behind, there is Thanksgiving to contend with then WHAM, it's Christmas. You can feel the stress build even now as you read this pastor letter. How did it get to be so late in the year already? Are these the feelings that are supposed to rise in us with the mere mention of Christmas day? Do you find that by the time Christmas day arrives that you are thoroughly weary and tired of the whole season? And who can blame us, Halloween decorations are out by early September and off the shelves by the second week of October, what is their replacement? Veteran Day gifts, Thanksgiving décor? No, Christmas decorations! Have we become a generation that enjoys the hype up to a holiday more than the day itself? Sometime in November, as things now stand, the "Christmas season" begins. The streets are hung with lights, the stores are decorated with red and green, and you can't turn on the radio without hearing songs about the spirit of the season and the glories of Santa Claus. The excitement builds to a climax on the morning of December 25th, and then it stops, abruptly. Christmas is over, the New Year begins, and people go back to their normal lives.

The traditional Christian celebration of Christmas is exactly the opposite. Advent is not Christmas. You know Christmas right? Shopping planning, buying, stressing, dinners, egg nog, Santa and you can add to the list. Christmas is not supposed to leave us breathless that is why we urge you to celebrate the Advent season correctly so you can enjoy in fullness the day that God broke into our midst in the form of this babe. Advent is expectant waiting, hopeful anticipation, and cheerful preparation of God breaking into our lives. Anticipation of past: the birth of Christ; the present: God in our lives every day, and the future: Christ coming again. In the secular world Advent or Christmas signals the end of the year, for the church, Advent is the expectation and preparation to celebrate the light breaking into the darkness. The anticipation of the coming babe in the manger signals the beginning of the church liturgical year. The season of Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas, and for nearly a month Christians await the coming of Christ in a spirit of expectation, anticipation and preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth by singing hymns of longing. Then, on December 25th, Christmas Day itself ushers in twelve days of celebration, ending only on January 6th with the feast of the Epiphany.

This year your pastors have designed the worship services to remind us of the "tip-toe anticipation" of the coming of God breaking into our lives in a stable, God breaking into our lives every day through the Holy Spirit and the expectation of Christ's coming again breaking into our lives for good. This year at New Market UMC you will experience hymns that are sung in longing and expectation of Christ's coming during the first three weeks of Advent. We also will also experience a slow trickle of hanging of the greens and placement of Christmas trees. Our goal is to enjoy the time of Advent as a season of expectation and to celebrate Christmas and the twelve days after with renewed joy instead of weariness of the season. The New Market choir will share a Christmas Cantata on the Sunday after Christmas and we will be singing extra Christmas hymn favorites through Epiphany Sunday. We look forward to sharing this special season with a new perspective, let us approach all of the seasons of our lives with a renewed and rejuvenated outlook to glorify God in all we do.

2016 Budget

The Finance team would like to thank everyone for their faithful giving and encourage everyone to prayerfully consider increasing their giving for next year. The final church budget for 2016 will be approximately \$195,000. This is roughly a 10% increase over last year's budget. It was a goal of NMUMC to increase the pastor salary from ¾ time to full time ministry in 2016. We are joyful to announce that this goal is accomplished. Your faithful giving supports all the ministry of NMUMC, from Sunday worship service, pastoral visits, outreach events, church social events, worship music, worship administration needs, nursery staff, to Kleenex and garbage bags. We thank you in advance for your love and support. The 2016 Budget will be available for review in late December. The 2016 giving envelopes will be in the rear of the sanctuary the last two weeks of advent. If you currently do not have assigned envelopes and would like to please contact the church office.

Ministry Focused Projects (Building Fund)

These improvements are intended to update our facilities and enhance our ability to do ministry. Each project will be completed as funds are available through your special offerings to the "Building Fund" During the year of 201 your faithful giving to the building fund has accomplished updating the Ed building to be capable of housing our new preschool. Heating and air were installed, a dividing wall, a fenced playground, new entry doors, new security entry system and new siding and gutters. The remaining projects are heating and cooling in the schoolhouse (\$14,000), repaving and possibly enlarging the parking lot (approximately \$45,000) and minor technology upgrades to the sanctuary (\$6,500). It is the Finance committee's goal to have these completed by the end of 2016. Thank you for your support. In 2015 \$40,000 were raised to fund these improvements. Way to go NMUMC!


